The number of pedestrians Killed or Seriously Injured (KSI) on Oxford Street during 2014 was the second lowest on record, whilst all pedestrian casualties fell by a quarter between 2013 and 2014, also to the second lowest level ever recorded.

The number of pedestrian KSIs on Oxford Street has fallen by more than two thirds (67 per cent) against the Government's 2005-09 baseline and all pedestrian casualties have also fallen by 46 per cent against the baseline.

Provisional figures to July 2015 show continued progress in pedestrian casualty reduction on Oxford Street and that year to date 2015 there have been no pedestrian fatalities on Oxford Street.
