Delivering More Together (Procurement)

Programme Management

Collaborative procurement group with rep from each FB and CRPT

- Monthly face to face meetings
- Weekly conference call

Programme management co-ordinated by TfL

RP Involvement

- Input into each collaborative contract to ensure appropriate RP provision
- Facilitates direct engagement with wider buying community and raises awareness of RP implementation
- Demonstrates RP benefits can be achieved alongside savings and aggregation

Collaborative Procurement 2009/10 Preparation

- Lessons learnt workshop held December 08, successes and challenges identified
- Project initiation document for 09/10 programme being prepared including contract areas for collaboration
- Collaborative Procurement event planned for February 2009

PROCUREMENT ACHIEVEMENTS

£2.2M of savings from the first year of the programme

Category	Delivered Savings	Sustainability and supply
Mobile telephony	£379,000	Sustainable Reuse and Recycling of hardware at end of life
IT Consumables	£511,000	Reuse and Recycle eg. Ink cartridges
Couriers	£40, 000	Emissions monitoring, FORS, Equality in Service provision
Stationery	£332,000	MOD contract – fully sustainable option

Total Delivered £1,152,000

Total Forecasted **£2,279,000**
