At the Mayor's Question Time meeting on 17 September 2020, the London Assembly considered and approved a revised version of Standing Orders.

In accordance with Standing Order 1.1, changes to Standing Orders may only be effected if at least two-thirds of the whole number of the Members of the Assembly is present when a proposal to do so is voted upon. Although two-thirds of the Assembly must be present, only a simple majority is required to agree the changes.

As two-thirds of the Assembly was not present at the point in the meeting on 17 September 2020 when the changes to Standing Orders were voted upon, the changes to Standing Orders agreed at that meeting do not take effect.

In accordance with the provisions of The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020, for the period that the Regulations remain in force, approval to changes to Standing Orders may be agreed by a single Assembly Member acting under a delegation of authority.

At its meeting on 3 September 2020, the London Assembly agreed that, in relation to urgent matters only, a general delegation of authority in respect of the Assembly's powers and functions (apart from those that cannot under the Greater London Authority Act 1999 be delegated) be given to the Chair of the GLA Oversight Committee, in consultation with the Deputy Chairman of that Committee, party Group Leaders, Caroline Pidgeon MBE AM and any relevant committee Chair(s), from 3 September 2020 to 17 December 2020.

Approval to the changes to Standing Orders is now sought in accordance with the terms of that delegation of authority.
