1. Minutes and Actions of 17 June 2020 Meeting

1.1. The minutes of the 17 June 2020 Oversight Board meeting were agreed.

Disproportionality in Strip Search

1.2. The further analysis of the strip search data that was requested at the June meeting was discussed. The MPS outlined a range of initiatives underway aimed at addressing disproportionality issues in the use of strip search in custody.

Community Engagement

1.3. Further information on the MPS's community engagement plans, as requested at the June meeting, was discussed.

2. Victims

- 2.1. The MPS provided a comprehensive update on its work in the following key workstreams to support victims of crime:
 - the victims' experience;
 - witness care; and
 - victims of rape and domestic abuse.
- 2.2. The Board:
 - Noted the recently established MPS Victim Care Team and the actions it is progressing to improve the victim's experience within the criminal justice system;

- Noted that the MPS will be making the necessary changes to ensure compliance with the revised Victims' Code of Practice;
- Noted the current provision of victim and witness care post-charge in London via the MPS Witness Care Units and the CPS Victim Liaison Unit;
- Noted the proposal being explored by MOPAC and the London Victims' Commissioner to introduce a Victim Care Hub;
- Noted the focus the MPS has been giving to investigations of rape to improve outcomes; and
- Noted the MPS position on handling domestic abuse cases.

The three papers presented to the Board are published alongside these minutes.

3. MPS Business Plan Monitoring Quarter 1 Report

3.1. There was a discussion of the progress the MPS had made in the first quarter of 2020-21 towards implementing its Business Plan and the impact of the pandemic on the workforce and organisation.
