Re: Transport for London funding package

I am writing to you to ask that you urgently publish the full terms of the funding and financing package reached between the Government and Transport for London (TfL).

The Transport Committee recognises that Government financial support to TfL is required during this extremely difficult period. London's transport system is the lifeblood of the city and it is vital to the economic and social recovery of London in the midst of COVID-19, and as we emerge from it. It is essential that buses and Tubes continue to run, so that journeys that depend on public transport can be made in ways that are safe for passengers and transport workers.

Since the announcement of the deal last week, it has become clear that there remains some uncertainty about elements of the deal and requirements attached to it. This uncertainty is unhelpful for all impacted by the deal and must be resolved. It is vital that we can assess the deal in its entirety at the soonest opportunity. This will not only enable us to continue to hold the Mayor and TfL to account in their efforts to deliver for all Londoners; it will also help ensure that Londoners know why and how decisions impacting them were made.
