

Please be advised that you may also be at risk of committing a criminal offence. Under the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (England) (No. 4) Regulations 2020 no person may participate in a gathering of more than 2 persons in a public outdoor place (or 2 or more persons in any other outdoor place, such as the outdoor area of any private premises), unless certain exemptions apply.

As you are aware, we have been carrying out an Internal Audit (16 767) of 'Management of Trams Operational Risk', which started in October 2016. The objective of the audit was to seek assurance that FirstGroup (Trams Operations Limited (TOL)) have the appropriate arrangements in place to manage operational risk and the relevant competence based risk controls.

At the time of the incident at Sandilands on the 9 November, evidence gathering was nearing completion with report drafting underway. In light of that incident we have decided that it would not be appropriate to continue with finalising our report at this time. In order for our report to be meaningful we would need to carry out further work in relation to the incident itself. It would not be sensible for us to try to do this at a time when our work might be seen as hampering the ongoing internal and external investigations or as pre-judging the investigation findings. Following the publication of the results of the formal investigations by TfL and the RAIB, we will review our audit and assurance activities relating to Tram Operations, taking account of any findings and recommendations from the investigation reports.
