Introduction

This summary contains information from the Greater London Authority (GLA), its Functional Bodies and the London Pension Fund Agency's (LPFA) Statements of Accounts for 2011/12. The information summarises how the Greater London Authority, the Functional Bodies and the London Pension Fund Authority spent the money they received during the year and their reserves position at 31 March 2012.

This Summary Statement of Accounts is prepared under s134 of the Greater London Authority Act 1999. Each organisation reported herein prepares its own detailed accounts separately. Copies of the full accounts may be obtained by contacting the individual bodies, whose contact details are at the end of this document or by clicking on the hyper links embedded in this document.

The **main responsibilities** of each functional body of the Greater London Authority are:

The Metropolitan Police Authority (MPA) to 16 January 2012 and from then the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC).	The primary function of MOPAC is to secure the maintenance of an efficient and effective metropolitan police force in London.
London Fire & Emergency Planning Authority (LFEPA)	Responsible for the London Fire Brigade
Transport for London (TfL)	Transport links, including major roads, underground, buses, Docklands Light Railway, London Overground and Crossrail
London Development Agency (LDA) (abolished 31 March 2012)	The Mayor's agency for delivering sustainable economic growth

The **relationship** between the GLA and each of the functional bodies is set out below:

The **LDA** was a Regional Development Agency and a functional body of the GLA. The Mayor appointed the LDA Board and the Mayor gave directions and guidance in relation to the exercise of the LDA's functions. The Government approved an annual grant to the LDA and imposed conditions on its usage. However, the Mayor determined the LDA's budget requirement and borrowing limits up to and including 2011-12. The LDA has consolidated SME Wholesale Finance Ltd as a subsidiary in its Statement of Accounts. The LDA was abolished on 31 March 2012 and the majority of its economic and regeneration functions transferred to the GLA.

LFEPA is a functional body of the GLA. The Mayor appoints all LFEPA's 17 Members and chooses one of them to be the Chairman of the Authority. Eight are nominated from the London Assembly, seven from the London Boroughs and two Mayoral appointees. The Mayor has the power to give LFEPA directions and guidance. The Mayor is responsible for setting LFEPA's council tax requirement (from 2012-13), its budget requirement (until 2011-12) and borrowing limits.

The **MPA** was a functional body of the GLA until 16 January 2012. The MPA comprised of 12 London Assembly members, appointed to the Authority by the Mayor of London, and 11 Independent members. The Mayor was the direct line of accountability between the Metropolitan Police Service and the people of London and he appointed the Chair and Vice chair of the MPA. From 16 January 2012 the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (**MOPAC**) took over the responsibilities of the MPA and the Mayor appointed a Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime to undertake MOPAC's responsibilities. The Mayor was responsible for setting the MOPAC's council tax requirement (from 2012-13), MPA's budget requirement (until 2011-12) and MOPAC's/MPA's borrowing limits.

At the same time as the creation of MOPAC a separate body, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis (CPM) was established and made responsible for the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS). The primary function of MOPAC is to secure the maintenance of an efficient and effective metropolitan police force in London, and to hold the CPM to account for the exercise of operational policing duties under the Police Act 1996.

TfL is a functional body of the GLA and is a statutory corporation. The Mayor is the Chairman of TfL's Board and appoints the Board's membership. The Mayor is responsible for setting fares, TfL's council tax requirement (from 2012-13), its budget requirement (until 2011-12) and borrowing limits. The legal structure of TfL comprises:

- the Corporation, which is made up of London Streets, the Public Carriage Office and the corporate centre which for legal and accounting purposes, constitutes TfL; and
- the TfL Group which is made up of the Corporation and its subsidiaries, which are summarised below:

The financial statements of these companies are lodged at Companies House and also at the Charity Commission for the London Transport Museum Limited. The financial statements for the subsidiary companies for the period ended 31 March 2012 all received unqualified audit opinions.

Whilst not a functional body of the Greater London Authority, the Greater London Authority Act 1999 gives the Mayor certain powers in relation to the London Pensions Fund Authority, such as appointing members to the LPFA board.

Independent Auditor's Statement to the Greater London Authority

My responsibility is to report to you my opinion on the consistency of the summary financial statement within the Summary Statement of Accounts with the full annual accounts of the Greater London Authority, its functional bodies and the London Pensions Fund Authority.

I also read the other information set out in pages 3 to 5 of the Summary Statement of Accounts, and consider the implications for my report if I become aware of any misstatements or material inconsistencies with the summary financial statement. The other information comprises only the introduction and the background information on the Greater London Authority and its functional bodies.

I conducted my work in accordance with Bulletin 2008/03 'The auditor's statement on the summary financial statement in the United Kingdom' issued by the Auditing Practices Board. The independent auditors' reports on the full annual accounts of the Greater London Authority, its functional bodies and the London Pensions Fund Authority describe the basis of the audit opinions on those financial statements.

Opinion

In my opinion the summary financial statement is consistent with the full annual accounts of the Greater London Authority, its functional bodies and the London Pensions Fund Authority for the year ended 31 March 2012. I have not considered the effects of any events between the dates on which the independent auditors' signed their reports on the full annual accounts the Greater London Authority, its functional bodies and the London Pensions Fund Authority (27 September 2012, with the exception of: Transport for London, 13 July 2012; the London Development Agency, 29 August 2012; the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime, 24 September 2012; London Pensions Fund Authority, 28 September 2012) and the date of this statement.
