# Legal recommendation on the grounds of keeping the information confidential:

Part 2, section 43 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, provides an exemption to the general right of access to recorded information held by the London Fire Commissioner, where such a provision would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of the Commissioner. The information contained within this Part 2 of DMFD8 would create such a prejudice as publishing budgetary information before a procurement exercise is concluded would impede efforts to secure value for money. Withholding this information is in the public interest.

### Confidential decision and/or advice:

The invitation to tender for MEP services produced five compliant bids for the core lot, four compliant bids for the north lot and six compliant bids for the south lot. One of the suppliers, Interserve, who submitted a bid were disqualified from the process due to commercial qualifications being included and their refusal to remove these. The invitation to tender for Building Fabric services produced five compliant bids. The majority of bidders were Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs).

The detailed results and weightings are appended to this Part 2 report as the confidential appendices of report LFC-0045.

The cost of the new contracts based on these recommendations can be seen in the table below. This results in additional funding for the Technical and Commercial Services Department being required to award these contracts. In-year impacts will be met from the Commissioner's reserves, with future year impacts provided for within the Brigade's 2019/20 budget process.

The costs for year one are generally higher due to those costs including TUPE and transition costs which are only applicable in the first year during the mobilisation phase of the contracts.

The budgets for the financial year 2018/19 for both MEP and Building Fabric services are shown below along with the required budget as a result of these new contracts being awarded. For year one of the contracts an additional £1.54m is required and for years two–five of the contracts an additional £1.35m is required.
