- Due to continued efforts to improve data accuracy, the way "Reach" is calculated has changed for Bambu Project: Supporting Children impacted by Domestic Abuse, which means it cannot be coparable to previous quarters

Education
- Education programmes do not report in Q2 due to the summer holidays. This consists of PRU/AP Mentoring, inclusive & Nurturing Schools, Talk Matters and Difference Matters.

Communities

- Some of the interventions as part of the new funds (Robbery Fund, Additional Intensified Support and MyEnds Partnership Fund) are still mobilising. These funds report on a 6-monthly basis (Q2 & Q4).
