It was great to speak to you about our proposals to create a new urban district at Old Oak, with new and affordable homes, jobs, facilities and green spaces.

We will soon be launching the Old Oak regeneration strategy - our plan for a new and revitalised district at Old Oak - and the Ideas Book - where local artists and illustrators bring your feedback to life, capturing the ideas shared during our Place Labs about how Old Oak might take shape.



Community mooring - be part of Harlesden Canalside




This is an exciting opportunity for local businesses or community groups who are looking for space in the OPDC area to run activities.

As part of our Harlesden Canalside improvements, we've created space for a permanent narrow boat mooring for community uses, to neighbour the Young Brent Foundation's floating classroom. Moorings usually cost up to £600 every year and this is an excellent opportunity to deliver a community centre, a café, a pop-up shop or library or any use for local people to enjoy, without the added mooring costs.

Spotlight: Arc Theatre, No More Whispers



Arc Theatre is a non-profit community organisation, founded in 1984, who visit primary and secondary schools across London to engage with young people through drama and performance to raise awareness and encourage discussion about violence against women and hate crimes.

Using our Small Grants funding, they run dedicated workshops in the OPDC area with young people to facilitate interaction and reflection, helping students to understand the devastating impact of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) on individuals and communities where it is still practiced illegally in the UK.

The programme uses participative, live performance plus multi-media film, presentation and sensitive discussion to raise awareness of the issues surrounding FGM, helping both students and adults explore the practice and its consequences within the context of human rights and Violence Against Women and Girls.

With OPDC's funding, Arc Theatre also provides teacher training to help teachers in schools support and protect those who may be directly affected.

"Their engagement with our students allowed them to hear their points being played out without feeling embarrassed to say it in front of the group. The students were made to feel comfortable to talk about this very difficult topic."

Asda Park Royal: public consultation



Asda and Barratt London are working in partnership to prepare a planning application for a new development of around 1,500 new homes, community uses, public realm and open space on the current supermarket site in Park Royal.

In early October, they ran the first stage of their public consultation to inform the plans.
