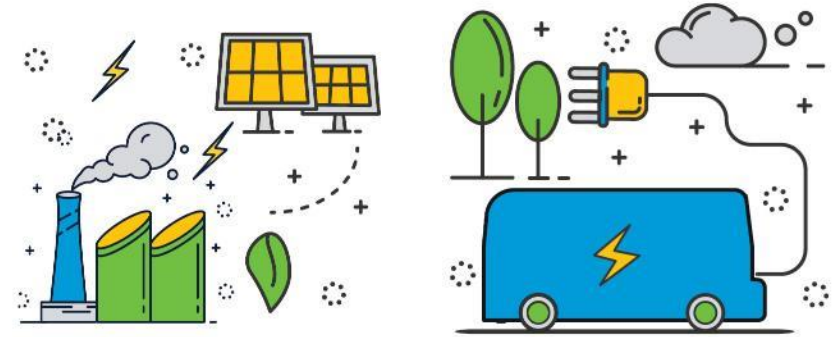

What is the fund?



Financed by Section 106 carbon offset contributions, paid by developments not meeting their carbon reduction targets on site.



Supports the empowerment of community-led decarbonisation projects in the borough.



Years 1-4 had £300,000 available in grants.



Haringey's Cabinet approved a four-year extension of grant funding (Year 5-8) to community groups in Feb 2025. Total amount of £400,000 available.



£100,000 has been allocated to Year 5.

What do we expect from your project?



Primary aim: Projects must show a demonstratable and measurable carbon saving for all medium and large grants.



Secondary aim: Projects must benefit, engage and empower the wider community on climate change and carbon reduction.



Contribute to Haringey's equality agenda. Engagement should reach beyond the immediate beneficiaries.



Bids must be submitted with a realistic and worked-out project plan.



Grants only for project-specific costs; carbon saving and/or engagement

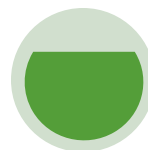

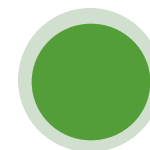

How can your project reflect, celebrate, or engage with local culture and creativity in a way that is meaningful to carbon reduction or climate resilience for your community?

Past examples:

- Changing theatre lighting stock to LED by Jackson's Lane Theatre
- Mural art piece using waste materials collected by children by West Green Playground
- Solar PV on Ten87 music studios
- Creation of videos with school children visiting local businesses
