18.00 speeches finish and most protestors begin to leave the square bar 3 small groups (around 15-20 people) not engaging in any prohibited activity. Most police leave the control zone bar one. 4-5 protestors begin to play live music (guitars, signing) in front of ghandi statue. Informed of bylaws by HWs but no-compliant initially.  
18.30 Female singing begins to shout homophobic and Islamophobic comments via p.a. system (singer claiming to be preaching Christianity). All police now left the control zone. Spoken to by HWs regarding legality of such statements and desisted and left the square. Reported to police in the vicinity external to the square. All protestors and equipment now gone.  
No damage found as in so far

16.10 200-300 protesters descend on PSG with no police presence, went onto grass and set up amplified sound equipment on Ghandi, displaying banners and other protest materials.

16.30 speeches beginning to be given from in front of Ghandi, informed of byelaws but non-compliant. Police on site 2x liaison, bronze informed but said would not provide assistance to HW as he wants them to stay on the square.

17.00 speeches continue. One police officer on site atmosphere is calm and no damage so far. Flyers also being handed out.

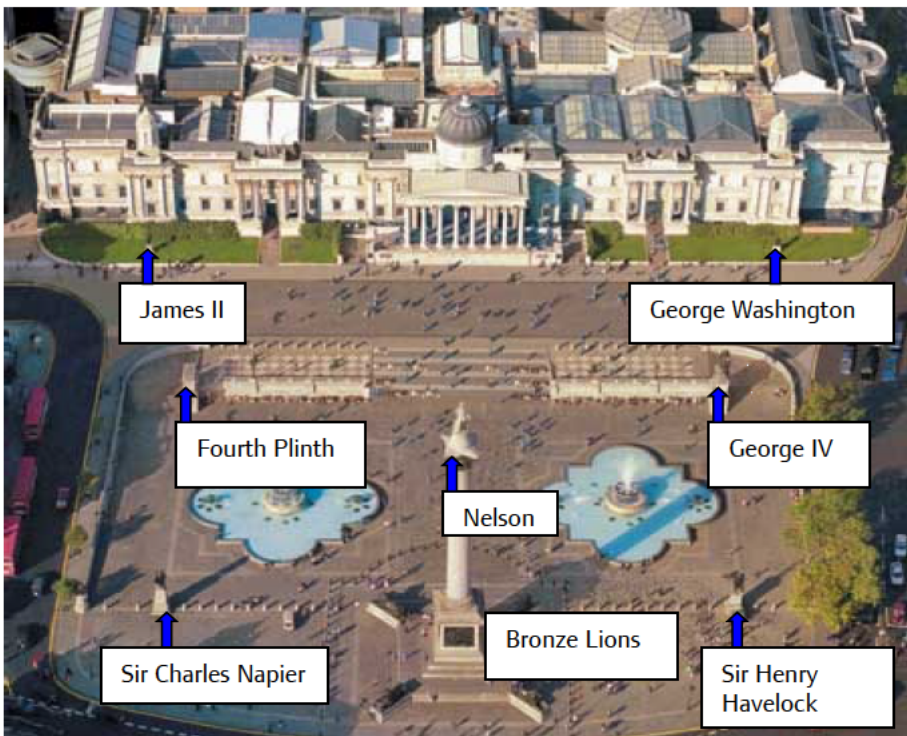
## **Fourth Plinth**

Over the past four years the 'empty' fourth plinth in the Northwest corner of Trafalgar Square has been home to some of the world's most innovative artworks. The Plinth was originally designed by Sir Charles Barry in 1841 to display an equestrian statue, however due to insufficient funds the statue was never completed. In 1998 – over one hundred and fifty years later – the Royal Society for the encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce (RSA) commissioned three contemporary sculptures by Mark Wallinger, Bill Woodrow and Rachel Whiteread to be displayed temporarily on the Plinth.

Following the enormous public interest generated by these commissions, the Mayor of London began the Fourth Plinth Commission to continue this tradition and build on its success. The Fourth Plinth has since featured works including Marc Quinn's Alison Lapper Pregnant (2005), Thomas Schütte's Model for a Hotel (2007) Anthony Gormley's popular One and Other (2009), Yinka Shonibare's Nelson's Ship in a Bottle (2010) and the current commission 'Powerless Structures Fig. 101' is a sculpture of a boy astride his rocking horse by Elmgreen & Dragset.

Commissioning Group: The Fourth Plinth Commissioning Group is a panel of specialist advisors appointed to guide and monitor the commissions for the plinth.

'Powerless Structures Fig. 101' will be in place until the summer of 2013 when it will be replaced by *Hahn / Cock* – a sculpture of a cockerel designed by German artist Katharina Fritsch.

For information here is information following the briefing I had with [REDACTED] this morning;

- There will be protests today – it was thought this would be the main BLM protest this weekend due to the far right protests proposed for tomorrow. However, so far it is has been relatively quiet in London this afternoon – therefore a worry there will be larger crowds tomorrow (there will also be better weather tomorrow)
- Tomorrow we are expecting (through social media chatter and Eventbrite invites set up) that there will be mobilisation of far right groups including Patriot Unity/Democratic Football Alliance and Britain First. The gathering will start at 11am from Whitehall
- 12.30pm tomorrow will be the BLM protest starting from Hyde Park – this has support from a number of anti-fascist groups and according to the press Momentum
- There will also be smaller protests in Enfield/Palmers Green/Islington to Hackney
- For Saturday the plan was to keep the far right protests in Trafalgar Square and the BLM protest in Parliament Square with the space outside Downing Street kept neutral – these plans may change and there will be a further update this afternoon
- On Sunday there will the Justice for Grenfell walk from Grenfell to Downing Street and also Afghan lives – a march from the Royal Albert Hall to the Iranian Embassy

On statues – the following statues will be covered (or have been covered);

- Winston Churchill
- James II
- George Washington
- Charles I
- Clive of India
- Ghandi (this was a late decision taken by the Mayor last night)
- Nelson Mandela

Also to note a small LSAT presence has returned to City Hall (one person for each shift). This was done with FM and the need for access to systems. They will be based for now in their old room.

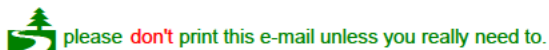

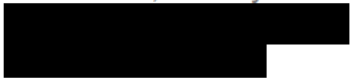

The response will naturally be about the new Commission making recommendations in the future, but are you able to help clarify ownership for me so I'm clear? I've got the below starting point.

Christopher Columbus: Belgrave Square Garden, Belgravia, London, SW1X 8PQ – not GLA land

Robert Clive: King Charles St, Westminster, SW1A 2AQ – not GLA land

Earl Mountbatten: Horse Guards road , SW1A 2AD – not GLA land
