Many congratulations on your reappointment. I want to take this opportunity at the start of a new government to restate my commitment to working with you and the Foreign and Commonwealth Office to promote our Capital around the world and to deliver a good Brexit deal for London and the UK.

As you are aware London's historic success is built on openness to people, ideas, trade and culture. My #Londonisopen campaign has been warmly received around the world and I am grateful to the support that you and your department are giving to it. I heard first hand from national leaders, visitors, businesspeople, students and investors, when I travelled to Canada, USA, Brussels and Paris and attended the World Economic Forum, that they are reassured by this message. British Ambassadors and High Commissioners in different territories have told me that they welcome the campaign, which will continue and will be a central plank of our plans to promote London as the best city in the world. This message of our openness to the world has become all the more necessary following the horrific terror attacks in London and I am determined that these cowardly actions will not deter people from visiting and doing business in our great city.

In order to secure future growth, we need trade with the EU to be protected and developed, and to avoid new tariff and non-tariff barriers being placed in the way of UK and European businesses. I also hope the issue of the rights of EU Nationals living in the UK, and UK nationals living in EU, can be resolved immediately.
