Thank you for your request for information which the Greater London Authority (GLA) received on 1 February 2021. Your request has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You requested:

- *The name of any statue, monument or public effigy that the council has removed from public show, or is considering removing from public show.*
- *Any cost associated with this.*

Our response to your request is below:

The GLA has not removed any public statues or monuments from public locations.

Within Trafalgar Square and Parliament Square, which are areas over which the GLA has management responsibility, the GLA did hoard a few statues on Parliament Square in 2020 to protect them from damage, removing them from public show for a few days only.
