

REQUEST

I want to know how many telephone helpline charities the mayor of London has contributed to as a grant donation etc over the last two years. Please specify name of helpline , amount given and date.

RESPONSE

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 15 February to the Mayor's Office for Policing And Crime (MOPAC), which you clarified on 5 March. I confirm that your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and that MOPAC does hold some information relating to your request. You asked: 'I want to know how many telephone helpline charities the mayor of London has contributed to as a grant donation etc over the last two years. Please specify name of helpline , amount given and date' - please see answers below:

1. Stop Hate UK - £80K over two years 2019-2020.
2. Modern Slavery Unseen helpline - £10k in 2019/20.
3. London Stalking Support Service delivered by Suzy Lamplugh Trust (SLT) - £152k in 2019/20.
4. The Home Office currently fund SLT for a separate programme through MOPAC for the Multi-Agency Stalking Interventions Programme (MASIP), funding broken down by each financial year they have received funding:
 - 2017/18: £42,495.00
 - 2018/19: £229,465.00
 - 2019/20: £287,829.00
 - 3 year total: £559,789.00
4. London Survivors Gateway, support for victims of sexual abuse and rape, led by Women and Girl's Network - total grant £1,530,000 from 2018 to present.
5. London Holistic Wrap Advocacy Support Service (Women affected by violence and have no recourse to public funds) delivered by Southall Black Sisters - grant amount this financial year £272,669
6. Ascent Advice Plus support for women experiencing domestic abuse and other forms of abuse led by Solace - grant amount this financial year £176,668
7. The Rape Crisis Centres (RCCs) all offer a telephone helpline service as part of their wider service delivery - grant is £2million towards RCCs, a portion of this money goes towards helpline support.
