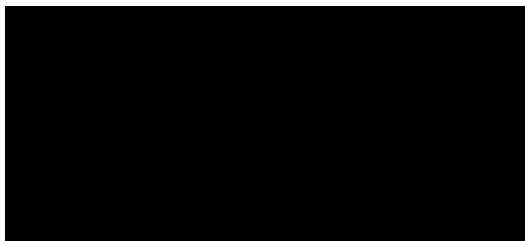

Freedom of Information request

Thank you for your email which was received by the Greater London Authority on 10 April

You asked:

- *Can you please supply under the above act now the money received from the congestion charge is used.*

Our response to your request is as follows:

The primary aim of the Congestion Charge is to cut traffic levels and congestion in London. By law, net revenue from the Congestion Charge must be spent on further improvements to transport across London.

The net revenues from the Congestion Charge are spent on improving transport in line with the Mayor's Transport Strategy. It is part of Transport for London's (TfL's) net income and is not earmarked for specific projects. TfL's income is used to run day-to-day operations and invest in assets to maintain and enhance the network. The net income from Congestions Charging in 2017/18 was £155.9 million.
