Dear Ms Alexander,

I am writing as General Manager of ofo, the UK's largest dockless bicycle provider, to offer my congratulations on your appointment as Deputy Mayor for Transport.

Given your longstanding interest in cycling, particular cycle safety issues, I would like to offer you a demonstration of one of our latest bikes. I would also welcome a meeting to discuss the opportunities that bike sharing can deliver, including helping London to become a healthier, more active city, improving air quality and reducing the high levels of congestion.

ofo launched in the UK in Cambridge last year, and have since enjoyed growing usage of our yellow bikes with users taking more than 400,000 rides and riding nearly half a million miles. We have since grown responsibly across the UK, only launching in coordination with the local authority and never without permission. This consultative and measured approach has seen ofo expand to six London boroughs in the last year, including Hackney, Islington, Southwark, Redbridge and Richmond, and UK cities including Oxford, Sheffield, and Norwich.

As you may know, ofo have been engaging with officers in Lewisham in recent months over a potential launch in the borough. We'd be delighted to go for a ride on an ofo with you to introduce you to ofo. We're also excited to have received permission to launch in both the London Borough of Wandsworth and Leeds later this month.

Our commitment to make our yellow bikes accessible to every Londoner means that ofo now covers a larger area than Santander cycles, bringing low-cost convenient bike share to more Londoners, including those who live in outer London boroughs.

We are the only dockless bike share operator in London to have consistently operated in compliance the TfL Code of Practice. Our operations team actively collect any bikes found in a non-participating borough and return them to our operating area if not returned by the last user.

ofo have also been working closely with Mike Brown and Gareth Powell at TfL in recent months, and are keen to bring you up to speed on our productive discussions with them.

If you would like to have a demonstration of an ofo bike and discuss these matters in more detail please contact me and we'll be very happy to arrange this for you.

Thank you for your letter of 9 May and for your kind congratulations on my new role. I would like to apologise for the delay in replying.


Getting more people cycling is a top priority for the Mayor, for Transport for London (TfL) and also for me personally. Dockless bike share schemes, including yours, are going to play an important role in helping us meet our ambitious targets in this area.

We welcome responsible bike hire schemes and that is why we developed the code of practice in collaboration with the London boroughs. This is helping operators to run their bike share schemes in a way that does not have negative impact on other cyclists, road users and pedestrians or result in unlawful highway obstruction. We are also looking closely at a range of additional policy approaches, including licensing. However, we need to learn from the current trials before developing a fixed solution.

I hope that you will understand but the pressures on my diary mean that I won't be able to accept your meeting request at this time, but I encourage you to continue to engage with the TfL team and Will Norman, the Walking and Cycling Commissioner, who is the lead in this area for the Mayor.
