Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 25 September 2020. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You asked for:

- 1. an up to date map of the finished works at the Property (Hindmans Way, Dagenham Dock),*
- 2. a detailed drawing of the Greater London Authority's roads and underground utilities and drainage discharges from the Property.*

We can today confirm that the GLA does not hold the information you have requested.

Specifically, referring to these two requests in the order raised in your request:

1. the finished highway works in Hindmans Way were completed by a private infrastructure contractor working for SEGRO Properties (not employed by the GLA).

Details of these works are available in the planning portal of the local planning authority, the London Borough of Barking & Dagenham,

2. GLA Land and Property Ltd (not the Greater London Authority) owns Hindmans Way.

Neither GLA Land and Property Limited / Greater London Authority nor the previous landowner has carried out works to Hindmans Way, except for occasional essential repairs to the road surface.

The underground utilities in Hindmans Way serving an industrial development plot on the western side of that road and associated drainage are set to be upgraded by SEGRO pursuant to a detailed planning consent they obtained for that plot, London Sustainable Industries Park

Cadent has adopted a former private medium pressure gas network in Hitch Street and in the southern section of Reef Street, both private estate roads in Dagenham Dock. Further details from Cadent.

Stolthaven Dagenham Limited (whose main terminal is located off the bottom of Hindmans Way) have, from time to time, made their own connections to the local drainage network. You would need to contact them direct for details.

You may want to consider writing to the local planning and highway authority as they might hold some information relating to your enquiry: London Borough of Barking & Dagenham, Town Hall, 1 Town Square, Barking, Essex IG11 7LU.
