WHAT IS THE ISSUE?

Social integration is about how we live together. When communities are integrated, people from diverse backgrounds, and of different genders and ages can build positive relationships. Social integration is important because it helps to create safer, healthier and fairer communities, in which people participate on an equal footing. But, as communities across London continue to change, they can become divided, which leads to discrimination between different social groupings.

WHO DOES IT AFFECT?

Millions of people live in
London, from a wide range of
backgrounds. Whilst our diversity makes
our city great, it can also cause division.
High levels of inequality across London
mean that people's daily experiences
are often separate from each other,
making it difficult for individuals and
communities to understand one another.

HOW DOES IT AFFECT ME?

As a young Londoner, you play a key role in helping to build strong communities, where everyone respects one another. When you make an effort to understand people unlike yourself, you'll be challenging issues like racism, sexism and ageism and showing that there is more that unites us than divides us.

KNOW THE FACTS

Data shows that...

- 21% of Londoners report that all their friends are of the same ethnicity as themselves.²⁷
- Londoners are more likely to experience loneliness than people in other parts of the UK.²⁷
- Estimates from the 2018 local elections, show voter turnout was just 36%.²⁸
