Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 13 September 2018. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Our response to your request is as follows:

I am writing to enquire about the latest up to date information on the number of properties that will be contributed to the housing moves scheme in the current year 2018-2019, by participating boroughs (relet element).

Please provide me with the current (2018-2019) calculated property contribution, of each of the participating boroughs (relet element) by bed space to the housing moves scheme (broken down into contributions per quarter).

Please provide with the list of participating boroughs(relet element,) that are restricted from adding properties on the housing moves system in the current or upcoming quarters of 2018-2019

Please also provide me with all documents (minutes, reports, or information) approved/scrutinised or provided to the 'London Housing Mobility Group' or the 'London Housing Mobility Working Group' ,from April 2015 to the present

Please find attached spreadsheet containing the total target number, the reduction due to equalisation and the total number contributed by borough. Please note Royal Borough Kensington & Chelsea do not participate and are excluded.

Whilst the scheme began part way through 2012/13, many boroughs joined later, therefore, we did not record the figures for 2012/13 as it was only a part year and no equalisation was necessary.

Please also find attached minutes that we hold within scope of your request. The names of staff have been redacted an are exempt from disclosure under s.40 (Personal information) of the Freedom of Information Act. This information could potentially identify specific employees and as such constitutes as personal data which is defined by Article 4(1) of the General Data

Protection Regulation (GDPR) to mean any information relating to an identified or identifiable living individual.
