You asked for a list of organisations who have received funding, including the amounts and the number of hours of support given if they have only been given advice or advisor time. Your request has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The names of the members of the Hub funding panel are exempt from disclosure under s.40 (Personal information) of the Freedom of Information Act. This information could potentially identify specific employees and as such constitutes as personal data which is defined by Article 4(1) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) to mean any information relating to an identified or identifiable living individual. It is considered that disclosure of this information would contravene the first data protection principle under Article 5(1) of GDPR which states that Personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner in relation to the data subject.

More widely, the GLA publishes the declared interests not only of the Mayor, his team and Assembly Members but also of senior GLA staff who may take formal decisions on behalf of the Authority.
