Title: Conversion of £7,000 of grant from Capital to Revenue for Melting Pot project

Executive Summary:

The proposal is to convert £7,000 of grant from Capital to Revenue for the London Sculpture Workshop's 'Melting Pot' project granted funding under the DD2015 Crowdfunding Programme Round 3.

The proposal is to change the original pledge of £17,000 capital and £3,000 revenue funding to £10,000 capital and £10,000 revenue funding. This is because some of the capital elements that we had intended to fund have now been secured through these in-kind donations, and so the proposal is to amend our pledge accordingly. This will result in a higher quality project where our funding is being used as effectively as possible, as opposed to them over spending on the remaining aspects of certain milestones to make sure that they don't lose the support of the Mayoral pledge.

Decision:

That the Assistant Director of Regeneration approves the conversion of \pounds 7,000 of grant from Capital to Revenue for the Melting Pot project being funded as part of the Mayor's Crowdfunding Programme.

PART I - NON-CONFIDENTIAL FACTS AND ADVICE Decision required – supporting report

1. Introduction and background

The proposal is to convert £7,000 of grant from Capital to Revenue for one of the projects granted funding under the DD2015 Crowdfunding Programme Round 3.

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Melting Pot at the London Sculpture Workshop managed to meet their ambitious crowdfunding target through securing some in-kind elements which Spacehive count as cash pledges towards the project. As a result of this though, some of the capital elements that we had intended to fund have now been secured through these in-kind donations, and so the proposal is to amend our pledge accordingly.

The proposal is to change our original pledge of £17,000 capital and £3,000 revenue funding to £10,000 capital and £10,000 revenue funding. This will result in a higher quality project where our funding is being used as effectively as possible, as opposed to them over spending on the remaining aspects of certain milestones to make sure that they don't lose the support of the Mayoral pledge.

The overall implication for the Mayor's Crowdfunding Programme would be that the £203,000 capital and £22,000 revenue the GLA Regeneration Team pledges for Round 3 would now amount to £196,000 capital and £29,000 revenue. This would leave the team with a £364,000 capital and £141,500 revenue for Round Four.

The cost of this swap will be managed within the \pounds 140,000 revenue allocation has been set aside and formally agreed via the LEP as approved by MD1561.

2. Objectives and expected outcomes

London Sculpture Workshop (LSW) is the only organization of its kind in London whose remit is centred on sculpture and 3D making. LSW are passionate about upskilling both members of the artistic community and the wider public through engagement with materials and have a record of working in the community with charities such as CRISIS to provide workshops for their users, and have engaged local primary schools in a series of material-led courses. Recently relocated to new premises in Woolwich, LSW have taken on more space and scope to implement our longstanding ambitions for further engagement. LSW therefore propose the construction of a community ceramics hub and foundry within our new space from which a series of practical sessions, open days and displays can be held. Our long-term ambitions are to embed this facility and create robust partnerships with programmes for all demographics including older people's services, youth projects and agencies supporting hard to reach groups.

- 5.1 The proposed grant award towards the 'Melting Pot' project remains at £20,000 as previously approved by DD2015. However, the original grant award was for £17,000 capital funding and £3,000 revenue funding. It is now being proposed that the grant award is evenly split between capital and revenue (£10,000 each).
- 5.2 As per DD2015, the capital element will be funded from the overall London Regeneration Fund and revenue element of the grant funded from and the Food Teams Healthier Streets Initiative allocation (£30,000) agreed by MD1618.
- 5.3 Any changes to this proposal will be subject to further approval via the Authority's decision-making process. All appropriate budget adjustments will be made.
