Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 10 May 2018. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You requested:

Any records associated with the number of individual devices with an IP address connecting to the IT networks associated with Greater London Authority each month from April 2016 until the present. We do not want any information that could be used to identify individual devices. However, it would be great if you could include a breakdown of how many devices of each type are connected if this information is available. A suggested breakdown for consideration is: Desktop computers, laptops, smartphones, printers, routers, servers, other.

In our request, devices refers to any technology that connects to the network via a wired or wireless IP connection. This will include desktop pcs and laptops as well as Internet of Things (IoT) devices such as smartphones, tablets, e-readers, projectors, media players and anything else with an IP address that connects to networks owned/managed by Greater London Authority. Similarly, 'IT networks' refers to wired and wireless connections owned by Greater London Authority.

Please find below the information we hold within the scope of your request:

We only hold information for the previous three months.

On our network we identified the following devices:

Desktop PCs: 994 Laptops: 350 Servers: 238

Network switches / routers etc: 44

Printers: 51

We don't have historical information about the number or types of wi-fi clients but the number of clients connected to the GLA Guest wi-fi network(s) over one day (Thurs 17 May) is as follows: 220

I should point out that under a shared services agreement, the Mayor's Office for Poling and Crime, who are based in City Hall, also use the GLA network and their devices are included in the figures above.
