

Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 18 January 2018. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Please find attached the information we hold within the scope of your request.

1) What oaths/promises did Mayor of London Boris Johnson have to sign in order to become Mayor of London?

Following his election, Boris Johnson was required to sign a section 20 form confirming he met the qualifications in the GLA Act to be Mayor.

He was also required (as per the GLA Act) to sign a Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

These requirements apply to anyone elected Mayor of London.

2) When he became Mayor, he had to sign something in a book in Westminster Abbey, what was that?

We are not sure what you are referring to. Boris Johnson was not required to sign anything at Westminster Abbey to become Mayor of London.

3) What codes of conduct (or related things) was Mayor Boris Johnson required to have kept to whilst Mayor of London?

As you say, the Mayor of London is required to abide by the GLA's <u>Code of Conduct</u> and s/he commits to doing so when s/he signs the Declaration of Acceptance of Office. The regime for enforcing the Code and some of the related forms etc changed somewhat between 2008 and 2016. But the document itself (as linked to) did not.

In addition to the Code of Conduct, the Authority maintains various policies and procedures, some of which apply to the Mayor. The most important of the GLA's policies and procedures can be found here: https://www.london.gov.uk/about-us/governance-and-spending/good-governance/our-procedures.

4) What is meant by the 'elected voice' of London? Is there a deeper legal meaning behind this phrase which is found here: http://archive.is/cbGa?

No. It reflects the simple fact that the Mayor is elected by Londoners and the role Mayors of London have played in representing Londoners.

5) I would like a full copy of the "declaration of acceptance of office for the mayor of London" which was signed by Boris Johnson when he became Mayor in 2016.

Please find attached a copy of the declaration signed by Boris Johnson when he became Mayor in 2008.

Therefore the above undertaking must be included in the declaration of acceptance of office as an additional item to the words of the prescribed declaration: see the explanatory notes to the Order.
