Thank you for your follow-up request for information which the GLA received on 12th January 2019. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

In reference to your previous request for information dated 26th December 2018 (reference number: MGLA281218-1569) you asked for the number of affordable homes in London that received public money where the full price of the property is over £500,000, on an annual basis, which the GLA responded on 8th January 2019.

You have now asked for a follow-up request:

Could I please follow this up by asking for the same figures but going back to 2010?

Firstly, my apologies, but in reviewing the figures provided in the previous response I note that these were based on number of bedrooms instead of the number of affordable homes. The corrected table, is below showing the number of affordable home where the market value of the property is over £500,000 from 2015-16 and beyond.

Please note that you requested a full price of property however, we do not hold the full purchase price and instead, we collect the average market value for shared ownership units. Therefore, we have provided the number of affordable homes in London where the average market value is over £500,000.

I apologise for any inconvenience caused.
