Hope you are well, and that there are some exciting things on the horizon now the mayor has been elected.

Please see attached a letter from Tom Williams, COO of parkrun. Parkrun England are seeking to restart all parkruns in England on 5<sup>th</sup> June. As an organised outdoor sport event this has been technically legal since 12<sup>th</sup> April, but they felt June was an appropriate time to reopen. Parkrun are seeking the permission of all landowners to restart parkrun on this date, with a COVID risk assessment in place. Much more detail is included in the letter.

Pre-COVID Victoria Dock parkrun started by the crystal, and the route went as far as the East end of the ExCeL building on the North of the dock, and just beyond the footbridge on the south side. Given the work on the cranes, the route would be significantly changed and until all the works are done the runners would turn around at the corner next to Western Beach (they would do the north side of the dock twice).

Please could you advise me who is the best person to speak to so we can secure permission to restart? I used to speak to but I know he has moved on. We are in conversations with RoDMA, Warwick estates and ExCeL too.

We have removed our equipment from the crystal community hut, but are hoping that expressway will let us store things there. We still plan to use the crystal green as our start/end point.

Dear landowner,

As an organised sport participation event, in line with the Government's Roadmap out of lockdown, and with the backing of the Minister for Sport (see supporting letter), we are seeking confirmation of continued permission to deliver the following parkrun event(s) on your land from Saturday 5 June:

• Applicable parkrun event(s)

Please reply to this email with confirmation of permission at your earliest convenience.

In England we have 589 5k parkrun events, with an average attendance of 263 walkers and runners, and over three million people registered to take part. More than 1,500 GP practices are registered as official parkrun practices as part of our partnership with the Royal College of General Practitioners, and 24 events on custodial sites in the UK.

Since last summer we have worked closely with Sport England, the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS), and public health experts, in order to best understand the most appropriate time for our events to return, and the processes they should follow when they do so.

In August 2020, we commissioned the University of Canterbury and Christchurch to carry out a <u>review</u> of available scientific literature relating to outdoor transmission of COVID-19, which further added to the evidence base behind the development of <u>our COVID-19 Framework</u>.

That review has since been <u>referenced</u> by the Public Health England Transmission Group, stating that:

"recent reviews considering data from several countries found very little evidence of outdoor transmission for SARS-CoV-2, influenza or other respiratory viruses"

Reflecting on the Government's roadmap for England, alongside the associated DCMS guidance, and following careful consideration, we concluded that Step 3 would be the most appropriate time for our 5k events to return.

And as the Sports Minister notes in his letter (attached):

"These events were allowed from 29 March as part of Step 1 of the government's response to the Covid-19 Roadmap. I welcome the extra care and caution which you have taken in delaying your return until rates of infection have further reduced and more people have been vaccinated, and I note that you have also had encouraging preliminary results of research which you commissioned to help understand the risk of transmission [at] your events."

All parkrun event teams around the world, including in England, are required to read, understand, and agree to our COVID-19 Framework, and we have a number of tools that we use to ensure compliance. So far, that process has supported the return of over 600 parkrun events across countries such as Australia, New Zealand, Japan, and Russia, as well as in Guernsey, Jersey, the Isle of Man and the Falkland Islands. And for the last three weekends it has enabled the return of over 100 junior parkrun events in England, following which we're pleased to say that feedback from English landowners has been incredibly positive:

"Everything went according to plan, and worked exceptionally well... the whole morning was seamless in operations, no issues, no overcrowding, everyone respected walking in as the main gates were closed, no incidents, no issues."

In order to fully understand and consider the public health implications associated with the reopening of parkrun events across England, we commissioned an expert in the transmission and control of infectious disease to model the risk of COVID-19 transmission at our events. That report demonstrated an exceptionally low risk of virus transmission, with Professor Clive Beggs concluding that:

it would appear feasible to recommence parkruns in England from June 2021, especially given that:

the UK government plans to allow 'high risk' settings such as pubs, nightclubs, and large indoor venues to re-open at approximately the time"

As Chrissie Wellington OBE (parkrun's Global Lead for Health and Wellbeing) wrote recently, we welcome the Government's championing of the return to organised sport and the priority that has been given to being active in the fresh air as a means of addressing some of the entrenched health problems facing our society.

However, opportunities to be active with others need to exist that are cost effective, that can be delivered regularly, that are outside, and that are open to all. Such opportunities have dwindled over the last year, and unfortunately there is a very real risk that some may never return or be prohibitively costly for many people to take part in.

Alongside the well-established benefits and need for physical activity, a recent peer-reviewed journal article, <u>published in Sports Medicine</u> concluded that:

"Regular, moderate to vigorous physical activity is associated with reduced risk of community-acquired infectious diseases and infectious disease mortality, enhances the first line of defence of the immune system, and increases the potency of vaccination."

The evidence is clear then, that not only are the health benefits of walking, jogging, running, or volunteering at parkrun events incredibly high, but the risks of infection are exceptionally low, and falling further every single day.

Referring to our planned return of 5k parkrun events across England from 5 June, Professor Dame Sally Davies, former Chief Medical Officer for England, and current Master of Trinity College, Cambridge University, said:

"parkrun communities should take confidence from the findings that walking, running, jogging or volunteering at parkrun is likely to be very safe. Now, more than ever, we need parkrun to improve our nation's public health and happiness. Our wellbeing, physical health and mental health depend on us being active and being together, in line with the government's guidelines and parkrun's COVID-19 Framework."

To allow any 5k parkrun events to reopen in England we need the large majority to do so, in order to prevent those that do from becoming overwhelmed with participants.

The time is right for 5k parkrun events to reopen. Our return in June complies with the Roadmap for England, is welcomed by the Government and public health, and will be delivered within an appropriate and safe environment.

We look forward to hearing from you, in order that we can confirm the return of this local public health initiative as soon as is practically possible.

Please see attached a letter from Tom Williams, COO of parkrun. Parkrun England are seeking to restart all parkruns in England on 5<sup>th</sup> June. As an organised outdoor sport event this has been technically legal since 12<sup>th</sup> April, but they felt June was an appropriate time to reopen. Parkrun are seeking the permission of all landowners to restart parkrun on this date, with a COVID risk assessment in place. Much more detail is included in the letter.

Pre-COVID Victoria Dock parkrun started by the crystal, and the route went as far as the East end of the ExCeL building on the North side of the dock, and just beyond the footbridge on the south side. Given the current work on the cranes, the route would be significantly changed - until the works are done the runners would turn around at the corner next to Western Beach (and do the north side of the dock twice).





at parkrun events incredibly high, but the risks of infection are exceptionally low, and falling further every single day.

Our wellbeing, physical health and mental health depend on us being active and being together, in line with the government's guidelines and parkrun's COVID-19 Framework."

And as the Sports Minister notes in his letter< https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-k>:

"These events were allowed from 29 March as part of Step 1 of the government's response to the Covid-19 Roadmap. I welcome the extra care and caution which you have taken in delaying your return until rates of infection have further reduced and more people have been vaccinated, and I note that you have also had encouraging preliminary results of research which you commissioned to help understand the risk of transmission [at] your events."

All parkrun event teams around the world, including in England, are required to read, understand, and agree to our COVID-19 Framework, and we have a number of tools that we use to ensure compliance. So far, that process has supported the return of over 600 parkrun events across countries such as Australia, New Zealand, Japan, and Russia, as well as in Guernsey, Jersey, the Isle of Man and the Falkland Islands. And for the last three weekends it has enabled the return of over 100 junior parkrun events in England, following which we're pleased to say that feedback from English landowners has been incredibly positive:

"Everything went according to plan, and worked exceptionally well... the whole morning was seamless in operations, no issues, no overcrowding, everyone respected walking in as the main gates were closed, no incidents, no issues."

In order to fully understand and consider the public health implications associated with the reopening of parkrun events across England, we commissioned an expert in the transmission and control of infectious disease to model the risk of COVID-19 transmission at our events. That report<a href="https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-u">https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-u</a> demonstrated an exceptionally low risk of virus transmission, with Professor Clive Beggs concluding that:

"it would appear feasible to recommence parkruns in England from June 2021, especially given that the UK government plans to allow 'high risk' settings such as pubs, nightclubs, and large indoor venues to re-open at approximately the time"

As Chrissie Wellington OBE (parkrun's Global Lead for Health and Wellbeing) wrote recently<a href="https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-b">https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-n</a> of the return to organised sport and the priority that has been given to being active in the fresh air as a means of addressing some of the entrenched health problems facing our society.

However, opportunities to be active with others need to exist that are cost effective, that can be delivered regularly, that are outside, and that are open to all. Such opportunities have dwindled over the last year, and unfortunately there is a very real risk that some may never return or be prohibitively costly for many people to take part in.

Alongside the well-established benefits and need for physical activity, a recent peer-reviewed journal article, published in Sports Medicine<a href="https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-p">https://email.parkrun.com/t/i-l-mkjikil-tlcujdrkr-p</a>, concluded that:

"Regular, moderate to vigorous physical activity is associated with reduced risk of community-acquired infectious diseases and infectious disease mortality, enhances the first line of defence of the immune system, and increases the potency of vaccination."

The evidence is clear then, that not only are the health benefits of walking, jogging, running, or volunteering at parkrun events incredibly high, but the risks of infection are exceptionally low, and falling further every single day.

Referring to our planned return of 5k parkrun events across England from 5 June, Professor Dame Sally Davies, former Chief Medical Officer for England, and current Master of Trinity College, Cambridge University, said:

"parkrun communities should take confidence from the findings that walking, running, jogging or volunteering at parkrun is likely to be very safe. Now, more than ever, we need parkrun to improve our nation's public health and happiness. Our wellbeing, physical health and mental health depend on us being active and being together, in line with the government's guidelines and parkrun's COVID-19 Framework."

To allow any 5k parkrun events to reopen in England we need the large majority to do so, in order to prevent those that do from becoming overwhelmed with participants.

The time is right for 5k parkrun events to reopen. Our return in June complies with the Roadmap for England, is welcomed by the Government and public health, and will be delivered within an appropriate and safe environment.

We look forward to hearing from you, in order that we can confirm the return of this local public health initiative as soon as is practically possible.
