I refer to your letter received on 5 February 2016 consulting the Mayor of London on the above planning application, which is referable under Category 3D of the Schedule to the Order 2008. I have assessed the details of the application for creation of Burial Ground with ancillary buildings, parking and landscaping. It is noted that this application is a repeat submission of the previous application assessed in January 2015 (LPA application ref: P1512.14), which the Mayor has supported (GLA ref: D&P3558). Therefore, I have concluded that the proposal does not raise any new strategic planning issues. That said, the applicant and the Council are advised to work with Transport for London on transport matters.

Therefore, under article 5(2) of the above Order the Mayor of London does not need to be consulted further on this application. Your Council may, therefore, proceed to determine the application without further reference to the GLA.
