Decision required – supporting report

7. Introduction and background

- 1.1 As part of the on-going process of managing contracts and tendering/re-tendering for goods and services, Procurement Services identifies contracts which require DMPC approval for either extension or to initiate contract action to tender or re-tender for goods or services or to award contracts.
- 1.2 This paper is in respect of the supply and installation of Airwave in-building installation at the Olympic Park Stadium. Currently the airwave coverage in the Olympic stadium is inadequate for the MPS to effectively police the stadium under a Special Policing Service (Section 25 Police Act 1996). The estimated cost of the installation and maintenance is £544k.

2. Issues for consideration

- 2.1. A full in-building solution is recommended to be installed to guarantee radio coverage and capacity for the emergency services. The stadium, managed by London Stadium 185 (LS185), has agreed to meet the full cost of this installation and ongoing maintenance.
- 2.2. Airwave is the national supplier of the Tetra communications system and as such are the only supplier. Due to Airwave only contracting with the emergency services direct, the Met is required to procure the equipment/installation making MOPAC the contracting Authority. In line with current corporate governance any new money over £500k requires MOPAC approval. There is an existing contract with both Airwave and Capita that will be used.

3. Financial Comments

3.1. The cost of the proposal will be met from London Stadium 185.

4. Legai Comments

- 4.1. The recommendation can be lawfully approved in accordance with MOPAC Contract Regulations and EU/UK Procurement law.
- 4.2. In accordance with the MOPAC Scheme of Delegation and Consent (4.8), the DMPC must approve all requests to go out to tender for contracts that exceed £500,000.

Installation of Airwave into the London Stadium (Previously Olympic Stadium) Investment & advisory Board - Virtual Paper

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This paper concerns the purchase and installation of a full in-building Airwave communication solution for the London Stadium (previously known as Olympic Stadium) to guarantee radio coverage and capacity for the emergency services. The costs of the installation and ongoing running costs will be refunded by the stadium management company LS185.

A. RECOMMENDATIONS - That

1. Approval to Spend £554,372 with Airwave Solutions Ltd (Airwave) for the installation of a full – in building communication solution. The spend will be broken down over 3 years with the first year being £458k, and second and third year will be £48k. LS185 have agreed to refund the MPS in full.

B. SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2. The MPS have a responsibility to ensure public safety at sporting events and other events in London in partnership with the organising parties. The stadium is a global venue that will attract large scale events throughout the year. The MPS carries these activities out under Special Policing Service (Section 25 (S25) Police act 1996) and as such we recover our full costs for policing the stadium footprint.
- 3. A Special Policing Service under S25 is a discretionary service that is requested by the event organiser and is outside of our core policing responsibilities hence the agreement of LS185 to pay in full for installation and support.
- 4. With the development of the new Emergency Services Network (ESN) which is currently estimated to begin in two years' time we have ensured the call off has the ability to extend if delay or we can terminate early with a notice period.
- 5. Digital Policing Radio Service team will be taking an oversight and assurance role in the management of the installation. They will ensure that the project is delivered on time and guality assure the final installation.
