# Title: Command and Control Residual Assets

#### **Executive Summary:**

The MPS is seeking approval for the allocation and release of funding to cover the costs of completing the Command and Control Residual Assets programme, which encompasses the Technical Refresh and Application Modernisation projects to be delivered by Unisys.

#### **Recommendation:**

The DMPC is asked to

- 1. Approve funding of £214k capital to compete and deliver the modernisation upgrades to Command and Control to improve functionality and deliver a savings in the run costs already built into the Digital Policing budget. The funding will be covered from a virement from the APNR programme, within the capital plan.
- 2. Approve funding of £524k revenue to cover necessary support and maintenance costs in order to keep C&C maintained and the mapping system supported will be funded from the Digital Policing 2017/18 revenue project budget.

#### **Decision required – supporting report**

#### 1. Introduction and background

- 1.1. The existing Command and Control was due to be replaced by October 2015, by CommandPoint. Following the termination of the Command and Control Futures Programme, the MPS still has a need for ongoing support.
- 1.2. This proposal will provide a technical refresh to replace hardware and software components that are at or nearing end of life. Additionally, an Application Modernisation will allow the rationalisation of the core software, remove dependencies on Unisys hardware and reduce ongoing service costs.

- 2.1. The upgrades can only be delivered with the involvement of both the MPS and other third parties who supply and manage the underlying infrastructure such as networks and connectivity.

## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

**This paper seeks approval** for additional funding of £738K for the Command & Control modernisation project. This consists of £214k capital to complete and deliver the upgrades to C&C to improve functionality and deliver a saving in the run costs already built into the DP budget. The funding will be covered from a vierement in the MOPAC approved capital plan from the APNR programme. Additional funding of £524k revenue is required to cover necessary support and maintenance costs in order to keep C&C maintained and the mapping system supported. This will be funded from the DP 17/18 project revenue budget.

# A. RECOMMENDATIONS

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1. It is recommended that the allocation and release of funding is approved, to enable ongoing support and maintenance of Command & Control systems, and upgrades which will reduce ongoing support charges.

# **B. SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

The modernisation of the CAD and CHS systems will help protect frontline business processes via the MetCC CAD and CHS services for a number of years before the main Command & Control replacement system is deployed. The funding will allow for a number of software and hardware upgrades to the C&C systems and therefore extend their life.

- 1. The existing C&C systems were due to be replaced by a new system, CommandPoint, by October 2015. With the late delivery, and later termination of CommandPoint, it was essential to extend the life and support of the existing C&C systems to October 2018.
- 2. As well as providing ongoing support, the contract also encompasses a Technical Refresh to replace hardware and software components that are at or nearing end of life, and an Application Modernisation to rationalise the core software, remove dependencies on Unisys hardware and reduce ongoing service costs.
- 3. To support the MPS strategic objective of exiting a data centre, the Technical Refresh workstream also relocated the C&C systems to the new MPS Data Centre whilst minimising operational and business impact.

- 4. The upgrades can only be delivered with the involvement of both the MPS and other third parties who supply and manage the underlying infrastructure such as networks and connectivity.
- 5. During the period of negotiating the Unisys extension (for support & maintenance of C&C in 2015), the extra license and support costs were not taken into consideration. The above work was funded as a block item and now the costs have been broken down it has become apparent that further funds are required to maintain the support of hardware. Once the true costs were established, it revealed an overspend and only now have the final costs been identified.

- 1. This spend is to fund ongoing support contracts, a technology refresh effort, and application enhancements which will reduce ongoing support costs.
- 2. Whilst the Unisys costs are fully funded under contract SS3/07/173 Service Variation Notices 152 and 153. These form part of the contract extension of the development, support and maintenance of the existing Command and Control (C&C) systems from 4th October 2015 to 3rd October 2018. Additional budget is required for MPS and other third party costs (e.g. BT) required to implement the Unisys projects and the support/license costs.
