Thank you for your email of 29 June 2016 in which you request the following information relating to the former Mayor of London, Boris Johnson. Your request has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act and I will answer each part of your request in turn.

- *Any correspondence by the [former] Mayor, internal or external, regarding the EU referendum.*

- *Minutes of any internal or private meetings by the [former] Mayor on the EU referendum prior to the vote.*

We do not hold the information you request.

- *Any meeting by any of the [former] Mayor's staff and external bodies on the subject of the vote*

We do not hold the information you request.

- *Any reports prepared by City Hall, the [former] Mayor's staff, or external bodies prior to the Referendum on the subject of the EU referendum.*
