Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 30 April 2020. Your request has been dealt with under the Environmental Information Regulations (EIR) 2004.

You asked for;

- 1. A strategy document that outlines the GLA's carbon strategy, which includes any strategy for using carbon offsets to meet carbon targets.
- 2. Details of all projects that offset payments have been made towards by the GLA since 2015, including who is running those projects, what is being done with the money in the projects, the value of payments made by the GLA, and over what period money is being.
- 3. Copies of any annual reports available from the past few years that are made by the GLA on LPAs' carbon offset funds, as P29 of this document indicates takes place: <a href="https://www.london.gov.uk/sites/default/files/carbon\_offsett\_funds\_guidance\_2018.pdf">https://www.london.gov.uk/sites/default/files/carbon\_offsett\_funds\_guidance\_2018.pdf</a>
- 4. Any strategy document or survey available that outlines what the GLA specifically looks at when it reports on offset funds including, if relevant, how it regulates whether carbon savings in offsetting projects are matching the carbon emitted in developments; how it determines whether offsetting projects are additional to projects that might already exist; and any other relevant regulation made by the GLA.
- 5. A record of any occasion since the establishment of carbon offset funds by LPAs when the GLA has contacted or reprimanded LPAs as a result of offsetting funds failing to work as they should. Please send any relevant documentation that refers to these occasions, including information on what the problem was that the GLA found, how the GLA then acted, and how the LPA then responded with respect to the problem found.

Our response to your request is as follows:

1. The GLA's strategy for achieving net zero carbon is set out in the Mayor's 1.5C Climate Action Plan which is available on our website: <a href="https://www.london.gov.uk/what-we-">https://www.london.gov.uk/what-we-</a>

- <u>do/environment/climate-change/climate-action-plan</u>. It explains that the zero carbon pathway assumes that there will be 10 per cent residual emissions which will need to be offset through negative emissions technologies.
- 2. The GLA offsets carbon emissions from flights through the carbon offsetting service provided by Carbon Footprint Ltd a leading carbon offset solutions provider and using Gold Standard Certified Emission Reduction carbon credits. From 2014/15 2018/19 the GLA's offsetting payments have been spent on the Zhangbei Dayangzhuang Wind Farm Project in China. In 2018/2019 the GLA's offsetting payment went towards the Nanyang Dankian River Solar Cooker Project in China.
- 3.   pdf. The questions may change year on year. A full list of questions asked as part of the 2019 survey are provided at the end of this response, see Annex 1. This includes questions relating to the carbon offset ratio i.e. the cost of the offset measure to save one tonne of carbon compared to the offset price per one tonne of carbon. As explained in the Carbon Offset Funds Guidance, a strict 1:1 ratio is not required. Boroughs were also asked questions about governance, auditing and reporting of their offset funds to ensure the necessary structures and processes are in place. It is the responsibility of individual boroughs to ensure offset funds are being set up and managed effectively and in line with the GLA's policy and quidance.
- 5. Each borough is responsible for setting up funds and collecting payments in line with GLA policy and guidance and any associated Local Plan policy. GLA officers provide advice and guidance to boroughs but it is for individual boroughs to determine how their fund will operate in practice in line with their own governance, auditing and reporting arrangements.
