

This evening, officers arrested a man at an address in Kent in connection with the disappearance of Sarah Everard.

He has been taken into custody at a London police station where he remains.

The man is a serving Metropolitan Police officer.

A woman has also been arrested at the same location on suspicion of assisting an offender. She has also been taken into custody at a London police station.

The Directorate of Professional Standards is aware.

Sarah's family has been kept updated of these developments.

Detective Chief Inspector Katherine Goodwin said: "This is a significant development in our inquiry. This is a fast moving investigation and we are doing everything we can to find Sarah.

"We have seen an overwhelming response from the public and I repeat my request for anyone with information that may be relevant to come forward, no matter how insignificant it may seem."

Assistant Commissioner Nick Ephgrave said: "The arrest this evening is a serious and significant development. We will continue to work with all speed on this investigation but the fact that the arrested man is a serving Metropolitan Police officer is both shocking and deeply disturbing.

"I understand there will be significant public concern but it is essential that the investigative team are given the time and space to continue their work."

We will not be issuing any further statement tonight.

Nick Ephgrave: Yesterday evening officers arrested a serving Metropolitan police officer at an address in Kent in connection with the disappearance of Sarah Everard. This man was taken into custody and remains in custody at a London police station. Our inquiry suggests that this officer was not on duty at the time of Sarah's disappearance. At the same time at the same location a woman was also arrested on suspicion of assisting an offender. She was also taken into custody and remains at a London police station.

This is a serious and significant development in our search for Sarah and the fact that the man who has been arrested is a serving Metropolitan Police officer is both shocking and deeply disturbing. I recognise the significant concern this will cause.

It's really important that the investigation team are given the space and time to find Sarah, and they're working at all speed to do so.

I would also like to thank all members of the public who have come forward. Since we made our appeal to give information, every piece of information is important to us. And I would reissue that request now that anyone who thinks they may know anything about Sarah's disappearance, to come forward. As a father myself of four young women, I can only imagine the anguish that Sarah's family are feeling at this very difficult time. And my thoughts and prayers and those the entire organisation are with them now.

The Met have advised they will be issuing the following update to media shortly.

Update: Sarah Everard investigation

A man arrested in connection with the disappearance of Sarah Everard remains in custody at a London police station.

The man, who is aged in his 40s, was arrested on the evening of Tuesday, 9 March on suspicion of kidnap. Today, Wednesday, 10 March, he has been further arrested on suspicion of murder and a separate allegation of indecent exposure.

The man is a serving Metropolitan Police officer in the Parliamentary and Diplomatic Protection unit. His primary role was uniformed patrol duties of diplomatic premises.

A woman, who is aged in her 30s, was also arrested on the evening of 9 March on suspicion of assisting an offender. She remains in custody.

Officers are searching locations in London and Kent including a property in Deal and an area of woodland near Ashford.

Following the arrest of the police officer, the Metropolitan Police has made a referral to the Independent Office for Police Conduct.



The Met Police Commissioner informed me early this morning about the deeply shocking and concerning development in the investigation into the disappearance of Sarah Everard.

As a father of two daughters myself, I can't begin to imagine the pain and terrible agonies that Sarah's family and friends are going through right now. My thoughts and prayers are with them for her safe return.

I have been in touch with Sarah's family since her disappearance, and I can assure them, and all Londoners, that the Met are doing absolutely everything they can to find Sarah.

Londoners will understandably be concerned about the development in this case and it right that the Met Police have referred this to be independently investigated by the police watchdog.

The police are carrying out an extensive investigation to find Sarah and Londoners will see more police officers carrying out reassurance patrols in the area.
