Thank you for your request for information which the Greater London Authority (GLA) received on 11 May 2021. Your request has been dealt with under the Environmental Information Regulations (EIR) 2004.

You asked for:

Specifically, I request that you provide all material held by any department of The Greater London Authority, London Assembly and/or Mayor of London's office pertaining to monitoring and measurement of air quality, noise levels or traffic flow within a 500 metre radius of the junction of Pope's Lane, Little Ealing Road and South Ealing Roads W5 between June 2012 and the date of this request as given above. As well as details of monitoring and measurement data, analysis of such data, and actions based on such data, I particularly ask for the inclusion of any internal correspondence that touches on any decisions made not to conduct monitoring or measurement activity.

Our response to your request is as follows:

Air quality monitoring takes place across London and is generally funded by the London Boroughs. The London Air Quality Map provides more information. It can be accessed here: London air quality map | London City Hall. Links from the map allow you to access full historical data sets for most of the monitoring stations, this data is hosted on external websites and is not owned by the GLA.

The London Atmospheric Emissions Inventory (LAEI) is the key tool for air quality analysis and policy development in London. It is a regularly updated database of pollutant emissions and sources including geographically referenced data and maps: <u>Air Quality Data – London Datastore</u>

You may also be interested to know about <u>Breathe London</u>, a GLA and Bloomberg Philanthropies funded monitoring network which complements the regulatory monitoring funded by the London boroughs. Community groups can buy in or apply for one of the Bloomberg-funded monitoring sensors.
