- Agree that the revenue budget shortfall from 2019/20 of £242k per annum is added to the Medium Term Financial Plan as a pressure for 2019/20 and that in the budget scrutiny sessions in 2018/19 savings are found to mitigate this funding gap.

1. Introduction and background

1.1. This tool is intended to support the Met's aim of becoming an information driven organisation where people will value, manage, protect and exploit the data and they will be equipped with information they can trust when making key decisions.

2. Issues for consideration

2.1. Digital Policing have identified the Application Management Service Tower as the preferred route to procure the requested solution. It is the most expedient route to market and is compliant to Public Contract Regulations, as the delivery of this solution is within the scope of the service provided by the AMS Tower supplier.

3. Financial Comments

- 3.1. The capital cost of £971k is fully funded from the Innovations Programme in the MOPAC approved 2018/19 capital plan.
- 3.2. The 2018/19 revenue spend of £201k is fully funded from MOPAC approved Digital Policing budgets.
- 3.3. The future years' revenue costs of £242k per annum are an unfunded pressure and it is intended that in the budget scrutiny sessions in 2018/19 savings are found to mitigate this funding gap.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This paper seeks approval to implement a search driven analytics and business intelligence tool that will enable self-service access to information by police officers and staff. The decision is required at July's IAM so that work can begin immediately to maximise benefits.

A. RECOMMENDATIONS -

Approve procurement and implementation of ThoughtSpot, a search driven analytics and business intelligence tool with capital spend of £971k and 2018/19 revenue spend of £201k fully funded from MOPAC approved Digital Policing (DP) budgets.

Agree that the revenue budget shortfall from 2019/20 of £242k per annum is added to the MTFP as a pressure for 2019/20 and that in the budget scrutiny sessions in 2018/19 savings are found to mitigate this funding gap.

B. SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 1. The Met is striving to become an information driven organisation where people will value, manage, protect and exploit the data and they will be equipped with information they can trust when making key decisions. This needs to be underpinned by the right tools that will allow Met to take full advantage of data available both internal and external.
- 2. The new analytics and business intelligence tool will enable access to data on a self-service basis, making it easier for officers and staff to explore and exploit the data. It will provide a natural language search driven functionality, in addition to dashboards and other reporting formats. The tool will enable officers to make more informed decisions, driving prevention by understanding trends and demands, improving performance management, and planning and forecasting.
- 3. The benefits of self-service access to information are supported by a number of demos to senior stakeholders, a trial that was conducted with officers from Romford followed by a workshop with a mix of staff and officers from different parts of the organisation. This was done using 2 years' worth of data that was extracted from EWMS, CRIS and Merlin.
- 4. Introduction of a new business intelligence tool supports Met's core objectives of
 - Every community safer
 - A safer London
 - A transformed, modern and efficient Met

and is in line with:

- Police and Crime Plan for London (better use of information)
- Digital Policing Strategy (information driven policing)
- Policing Vision 2025 (digital policing theme)
