Thank you for your email, which was received by the Greater London Authority on 12 August 2016.

Our response to your request is as follows:

- How many people are presently employed by City Hall at a rate of less than the London Living Wage (£9.40 per hour)?
- What percentage of the overall workforce at City Hall does this constitute?
- Does City Hall pay its casual and/or temporary staff the London Living Wage?

We pay all staff at least London's Living Wage. All temporary agency staff are paid at least London's Living Wage.

- Does City Hall outsource any of its work to contractors (such as its cleaning or catering, for example)?
 - o If so, are these workers paid the London Living Wage?
 - Are any enquiries or investigations made into whether these contractors pay the London Living Wage? If so, what are these enquiries?

City Hall does outsource some services to external suppliers, including cleaning and catering. All contractors working at City Hall are paid the London Living Wage as a minimum and this is a contractual requirement. Annual audits are carried out on the suppliers to ensure that the LLW or above is paid to all their staff.
