Executive Summary:

The Enterprise Architecture team uses outside resources to meet short to medium term demand and to bring in specialist skill sets. The current contracts are at the end of their life and a new competition is required. The lot structure has been designed so that parts of the requirement will be attractive to specialist suppliers and SMEs.

Money spent through this contract will be from existing budgets for the DP Business Engagement and Technology team or recharged to an existing DP programme. The purpose of this work is to put in place a cost effective and controlled delivery structure.

Approval is sought to run the commercial competitions and to award a contract to the winners of each lot. Approval is requested from DMPC as the total of the 4 contracts will be \pounds 4.7M.
