You requested:

Under the Freedom of Information Act, can you find out exactly as to how many of the "protesters" who attended this march yesterday were arrested and or fined for failing to observe the 2 metre social distancing law introduced by this government under emergency legislation to prevent the spread of Coronavirus? Furthermore, who exactly in Central Hall or government authorised it in the first place?

Please find below our response to your request:

The GLA does not hold information about any fines or arrests at the march on 3 June. The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) may have information about fine and arrests at the protest. Although the GLA and MPS are closely linked, they are separate Public Authorities for the purposes of The Freedom of Information Act 2000, as per schedule 1 of the Act. The organisers of the march on 3 June have not been in contact with the GLA to discuss any part of their plans. No permission was sought from or given by GLA for GLA controlled land (Trafalgar Square and Parliament Square Gardens).
