Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 10 April 2017. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You requested:

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

- 1) How many GLA vehicles are there (Met, Fire, Ambulance etc)
- 2) What will be the costs of replacing them when they breach the Mayor's emission scheme?
- 3) If they are to be exempt then I will take the Mayor to the Supreme Court re a flawed consultation process

The Ultra Low Emission Zone is currently out for consultation and it is not proposed to include an exemption for GLA vehicles.

- The London Fire and Emergency Planning Authority have a fleet of 508 vehicles
- The Metropolitan Police have a fleet of 5,186 vehicles
- Transport for London have a fleet of 1,575 vehicles and London's bus fleet is comprised of 9,186 buses
- The Greater London Authority does not have a vehicle fleet

Transport for London are working closely with other GLA fleet managers and sharing technical expertise to support and help them as the new requirements are introduced.

You will need to enquire with each of the functional bodies for the latest financial information on the cost of replacing or upgrading vehicles (if any) to comply with the Ultra Low Emission Zone.
