Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 20 December 2017. Your request has been dealt with under the Environment Information Regulations 2004 (EIR).

You asked for;

1. *Can I please get all of the correspondence between the mayor Sadiq Khan and the Department for Transport on the subject of Crossrail 2 between 1 September 2017 and 20 December 2017.*
2. *Can I please get all of the correspondence between the deputy mayor Val Shawcross and the Department for Transport of Crossrail 2 between 1 September and 20 December 2017.*
3. *Correspondence between the Mayor's Office and the Department for Transport between 1 September and the 20 December.*

Please find attached the information we have identified as being within the scope of your request.

Please note that a letter to the Treasury of 3 November was cc'd to the Department for Transport and that after careful consideration, we have decided that some of the information covered by your request is exempt information by virtue of the disclosure-exception provisions found under regulation 12(4)(d) of the EIR. Regulation 12(4)(d) provides that a public authority may refuse to disclose information that relates to material which is in the course of completion, to unfinished documents or to incomplete data. In this instance, the letter contains details about proposals which are currently incomplete.

The proposed route details, including any proposed alignment changes, and the consultation questions, are currently incomplete and will be published at the start of the next consultation, the date of which is to be confirmed. This exception is subject to a public interest test, which requires us to assess whether the public interest in applying the exception outweighs the public interest in disclosure. In this instance, it is considered that the public interest favours the finalisation of the information, after all relevant factors can be taken into account, rather than

the disclosure of information which does not accurately reflect any amendments that might still be made.
