

## **REQUEST**

Please could I have the book value, internal/ external valuation or EUV benchmark for all the police stations owned by MOPAC and those that have been sold.

Police stations sold since 2010 (how much for) and the EUV/ book value for these police stations and including those not sold if available.

## **RESPONSE**

Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FOI) request of 17 May to the Mayor's Office for Policing And Crime (MOPAC). I confirm that your request has been handled under the FOI Act 2000 and that MOPAC does hold some information relating to your request, set out below.

The link below provides the detail of sites sold since April 2013. Please note that these are sites irrespective of whether they are police stations or not. The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) define a police station as an operational building that has a front counter.

MOPAC does not hold the details of the specific book value or Existing Use Value (EUV) by site.

MOPAC is a functional body of the Greater London Authority responsible for oversight of the Metropolitan Police. It came into being on 16 January 2012 at midnight, replacing the Metropolitan Police Authority (MPA), as set out in the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011.
