RUSSIA – CORE SCRIPT (updated: 22 October 2013)

The bilateral relationship - overview

Russia remains a crucial partner for the UK. It's right that we maintain high level contact. Regular talks between the Prime Minister and President Putin have set the tone for a relationship on a stronger footing.

We work together in the UN Security Council on crucial issues relating to international security. In 2013, we've regularly held talks on Syria, Iran and the Middle East Peace Process. We don't always agree, but we're better off in dialogue with the Russians on these crucial questions.

The commercial relationship between our two countries is developing, with UK exports to Russia increasing by 80% from 2011-2013. People to people links are also strong, and 2014 will see the 2014 Russia UK Year of Culture.

There remain areas of disagreement, and it is only right that we're honest with each other on those areas. We can make more progress by working together on matters of real importance for the prosperity and security of people in both countries.

Since the Prime Minister visited Moscow in September 2011, there have been six bilateral meetings between the Prime Minister and Russian President and numerous other visits by senior government Ministers responsible for trade, defence and foreign policy.

The UK is also sharing expertise and experiences with Russia across a range of fields, including sport, as Russia prepares to host the 2014 Winter Olympics, 2018 World Cup.

During his May 2013 visit to Sochi to meet with President Putin, the Prime Minister agreed exceptionally to contacts between UK and Russian security services ahead of the 2014 Sochi Games in order to safeguard Team GB and travelling fans.

2014 has been designated the UK/Russia Year of Culture.

Litvinenko

Alexander Litvinenko, a former FSB officer granted asylum in the UK in 2001, died in November 2006 from radiation poisoning. The Metropolitan Police conducted an investigation into his death. In January 2007 the CPS decided that there was sufficient evidence to charge Andrei Lugovoy with the murder of Mr. Litvinenko and the CPS requested his extradition from Russia to the UK. This request was refused on the grounds that the Russian Constitution prohibits the extradition of its nationals. The CPS sought extradition of a second suspect, Dmitry Kovtun, in February 2012. HMG continues to seek justice in this case and regularly raises concerns with the Russian government.

In autumn 2011 the Coroner took the view that, as a criminal trial seemed unlikely, there was no reason to further delay an inquest into Mr. Litvinenko's death. The inquest is an independent judicial process convened to seek justice in the Litvinenko case, and we are committed to cooperating fully.

In July 2013 the government decided not to establish a public inquiry, but to keep this decision under review. We consider that the Coroner's inquest can effectively investigate the circumstances of Mr Litvinenko's death. Mr. Litvinenko's widow is seeking judicial review of

HMG's decision. The Government made an application to the court for Public Interest Immunity (PII) in respect of HMG's material on the death, in line with its duty to protect national security and international relations. The coroner upheld the PII in most, but not all respects, and HMG has challenged that decision by judicial review. The start of the inquest has been delayed while the two judicial reviews are considered.

Trade

Russia is the UK's fastest-growing major export market and now the UK's 12th biggest export market, ahead of Turkey, Japan and India. UK exports doubled between 2009 and 2011 and increased a further 15% in 2012 to £5.516 billion. Recent data shows that Russian economic growth has slowed in 2013 after three years of robust growth. The World Bank reduced its forecast for Russian GDP growth this year from 2.3% to 1.8%

Over 600 UK companies now operate in Russia. The UK and Russia engage in annual trade and investment talks at the Intergovernmental Steering Committee (ISC). The ISC is cochaired by the Business Secretary and Russian Deputy Prime Minister Igor Shuvalov. The next ISC is due to take place in November 2013 in Russia.

UK companies have experienced success in the Russian market in recent year. In March 2013, easyJet opened services to Moscow from London and Manchester. The Moscow-Manchester service allows a further 60,000 passengers a year take advantage of the first-ever direct scheduled link between the two cities, a massive boost to UK-Russia business. Over 60 UK companies won contracts for the Sochi Winter Olympics. These companies are in a strong position to win contracts for World Cup 2018.

Russia lifted the 17-year ban on imports of beef, lamb and mutton from the UK in November 2012. Further restrictions on the export of beef and lamb offal were lifted during Secretary of State DEFRA in September. The opening up of trade on meat exports has potential value of £100m over the next three years.

In 2012, BP acquired a stake in Rosneft, the largest publicly-quoted oil company in the world, and this summer in the margins of the G20 Rolls Royce and Rosatom signed a tri-partite agreement with a Finish company to work in third countries; the potential spin offs of which could amount to a benefit to the UK economy of £840m.

Syria

We are concerned that Russia continues to support the Assad regime in Syria, even though it is now clear that the regime has been using chemical weapons (CW) against its own people. The use of CW is part of a long list of continuing atrocities being committed by the Assad regime against the Syrian people every day. The international community has a responsibility to not stand idly by when there is clear evidence of CW use.

We are also concerned by the continuing supply of arms by Russia to the Assad regime.

We support US and Russian efforts to bring the Assad Regime and Syrian opposition to the table for a second Geneva conference. On the question of participation, it would be vital that anyone attending fully signed up to the already agreed principles of Geneva I. It is important that a conference is convened quickly to prevent further senseless loss of life in this conflict.

Human Rights

Human rights in Russia continue to follow a negative trend, with increased controls on civil society, restrictions on political opposition and the marginalisation of minority groups.

Human rights area central part of the UK-Russia relationship and we will continue to make it clear to Russia that it is in her interests to be governed by the rule of law and respect for human rights.

LGBT

The Government has strong concerns about the changes to the law in Russia prohibiting the promotion of "non-traditional sexual relations" among minors. In effect the law could prevent the LGBT community in Russia from fully enjoying the right to freedom of expression and peaceful assembly. The Prime Minister set out these concerns with President Putin in a meeting in St Petersburg on 6 September, making clear the strength of feeling in the UK and that it was in Russia's interests to tackle discrimination. British officials have been lobbying on the LGBT law since the first regional laws on "homosexual propaganda" were tabled.

We are working with the International Olympic Committee and the British Olympic Association to ensure that the Sochi Winter Olympics and Paralympics 2014 take place in the spirit of the Olympic Charter and are free from discrimination.

We have updated our travel advice for Russia to inform British Nationals of the new law. We are committed to providing a modern and efficient consular service for visitors to Sochi.

The Prime Minister does not support a boycott of the Sochi Games. We have a better chance of influencing Russia by engaging and challenging prejudices than by boycotting. Human rights will continue to be a central part of the UK-Russia relationship and we will continue to do all we can to urge Russia that it is in her interests to be governed by the rule of law and respect for human rights.

NGOs

We are concerned that Russian authorities began conducting inspections on a number of NGOs from March 2013, which follows on from the NGO "foreign agents" law passed in 2012. The Minister for Europe made our concerns clear in a statement at the end of March: "NGOs make a vital contribution to civil society and we urge the Russian authorities not to place groups advocating the protection of fundamental freedoms under special scrutiny."

Navalny

In July a court in Kirov sentenced prominent opposition figure Alexei Navalny, who took a lead role in the protests following the 2011 Duma elections, to five years in prison for embezzling £300,000 from timber firm KirovLes in 2009. The case is widely seen as politically motivated. The Foreign Secretary made a <u>statement</u> on the conviction, expressing concerns about selective justice and calling upon the Russian government to apply the rule of law in a non-discriminatory and proportionate way.

The day after his conviction Navalny was released on bail pending his appeal, in order to allow him to run as a candidate in the Moscow Mayoral election on 8 September. He came second with 27% of the vote. On 16 October, an appeals court in Kirov upheld Navalny's conviction for embezzlement from Kirovles, but suspended the 5 year prison term for a period of 5 years probation. In a separate and ongoing case, Navalny has been accused of defrauding a local branch of French cosmetics company Yves Rocher of \$1.8m in 2008.

Culture/British Council

2014 has been designated the UK/Russia Year of Culture. This was agreed in a Memorandum of Understanding on cultural exchange signed by the Foreign Secretary and

Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov. The Year of Culture includes elements on education, English language and space. This offers a good opportunity to build substantial engagement between the UK and Russian Higher Education sectors, launch a major bilateral programme, and celebrate UK/Russia HE and prosperity research partnerships in Space.

Activities will be overseen by two co-chairs, Russian Deputy Prime Minister Olga Golodets and Baroness D'Souza.

High profile individuals with asylum in UK

General policy is to not discuss individual cases. But the UK is bound by our obligations under the 1951 Refugee Convention and European Convention on Human Rights. A grant of asylum should not be interpreted as support for an individual's views and we expect everybody living or working in, or visiting, the UK, whatever their status, to observe our laws and regulations.

Extradition?

Extradition requests are decided in strict accordance with the law. There are stringent safeguards in our extradition legislation, including express reference to human rights, and a ground for refusal of politically motivated requests. These issues are decided by the independent courts.



Her Majesty's Ambassador to the Russian Federation

Mr Tim Barrow CMG LVO MBE has been appointed Her Majesty's Ambassador to the Russian Federation in succession to Dame Anne Fyfe Pringle DCMG. Mr Barrow will take up his appointment during November 2011.

Tim Barrow joined the FCO in 1986 and has held a wide range of posts doing both bilateral and multilateral work, including postings to Moscow, Brussels (to the European Union), and Kiev. He was most recently the UK Representative to the Political and Security Committee of the EU and, before that, Ambassador to Ukraine.

On his appointment as Her Majesty's Ambassador to the Russian Federation, Mr Barrow has said "I am very pleased to be returning to Russia. I have good memories of working in Moscow in the early 90s. I look forward to getting to know again this vast and dynamic country and to continuing the steady work of developing relations between our two countries".

UK - RUSSIA POLITICAL BRIEF

Overview of the UK/Russia bilateral relationship

Russia remains a crucial partner for the UK. Regular high level talks, including between the Prime Minister and President Putin, have set the tone for a relationship on a stronger footing. The commercial relationship is developing, with UK exports to Russia increasing by 80% from 2009-2012. People to people links are also strong, and 2014 will see the 2014 Russia UK Year of Culture.

The UK is also sharing expertise and experiences with Russia across a range of fields, including sport, as Russia prepares to host the 2014 Winter Olympics and 2018 World Cup. During his May 2013 visit to Sochi to meet with President Putin, the Prime Minister agreed exceptionally to contacts between UK and Russian security services ahead of the 2014 Sochi Games in order to safeguard Team GB and travelling fans.

There remain areas of disagreement, such as human rights, the ongoing refusal of Russia to extradite the key suspect on the murder of Litvinenko, as well as their posture towards Syria. However, the relationship is in a position where we can have frank and honest conversations with each other on those areas where we disagree.

Trade

Russia is the UK's fastest-growing major export market and now the UK's 12th biggest export market, ahead of Turkey, Japan and India. UK exports doubled between 2009 and 2011 and increased a further 15% in 2012 to £5.516 billion (and services worth £1.99bn making a total of £7.5bn). There are over 600 UK companies now operating in Russia.

UK companies have experienced success in the Russian market in recent years. In March 2013, EasyJet opened services to Moscow from London and Manchester. The Moscow- Manchester service allows a

further 60,000 passengers a year take advantage of the first-ever direct scheduled link between the two cities.

Over 60 UK companies have won contracts for the Sochi Winter Olympics. These companies are in a strong position to win contracts for World Cup 2018.

Russia lifted the 17-year ban on imports of beef, lamb and mutton from the UK in November 2012. On 16 September this year, Secretary of State for Environment Food and Rural Affairs, Owen Paterson, visited Moscow to mark the first deliveries in a contract estimated at up to £100m over 3 years.

UK-Russia trade figures

- UK exports of goods and services to Russia grew by 5.2% in 2012, reaching a total of £7.6 billion
- Russia was the fifteenth largest destination for UK goods and services exports in 2012, an improvement from eighteenth position in 2011.
- Russia is the largest market for UK goods exports in 2012 outside of the US, the EU and China.
- The UK imported £9.3 billion of goods and services from Russia in 2012.
- Income from UK investments in Russia reached £5.2 billion in 2012, making Russia the eighth largest source of UK investment income in the world.
- The Prime Minister and President Putin have both said that they want the UK-Russia trade relationship to develop further.

Economy narrative

Russia is the world's 8th largest economy. It is also one of world's largest energy producers and the EU's main supplier. Russia plays an important role in most of the major economic international organisations: it joined the WTO in 2012, chaired the G20 in 2013, will chair the G8 in 2014, and will chair the BRICS grouping and aims to join the OECD in 2015.

The Russia economy grew by 3.4% in 2012, but the growth rate has been falling since the second half of last year and the economy fell into a technical recession in the first half of 2013. The Economy Ministry has halved this year's growth forecast from 3.6% to 1.8%, which would be the slowest since the global economic crisis. The IMF has gone even further, reducing its forecast to 1.5% this year. In the decade before the global economic crisis, Russia grew by an average of 8% a year on the back of a global commodities boom. So growth of less than 2% would feel like a recession to many here and would not satisfy the demands of the electorate, which wants Russian living standards to catch up with those of the West.

The state of the global economy is partly to blame: commodity prices have fallen back, and the euro-zone – Russia's major export market – continues to make heavy weather. But Russia's economy has also reached full capacity. Unemployment, at 5.2%, is at its lowest for 20 years. Inflation, at 6.1%, has exceeded its target for 13 consecutive months. Russia is meanwhile suffering from chronic capacity constraints. Private investment has long been deterred by the poor business climate, while public investment in human capital and infrastructure consistently loses out to welfare, subsidies and security in the federal budget. And labour productivity is less than half the levels in OECD countries.

The slowdown has fuelled an intense debate among policymakers in Russia, who believe that the economy should be capable of growing at around 5% a year under the right conditions. But the range of policy options is limited and, in some cases, unpalatable.

There should be some scope to relax monetary policy now that inflation is starting to fall. But Elvira Nabiullina, the new central bank governor, is treading carefully. Russia still has one of the

highest rates of inflation in the G20, and she has consistently been cautious on the timing and impact of interest rate cuts, instead prioritising technical reforms to the Bank's monetary and foreign exchange policy.

Russia's balanced budget and low level of public debt could permit a fiscal stimulus. But the Government is concerned about Russia's dependence on oil and gas revenues, which account for around 50% of budget revenues and 75% of Russian exports. Therefore, new fiscal rules and relatively prudent budget policy are being used to limit government spending. However, President Putin has recently announced that some of Russia's reserve funds will be invested in flagship infrastructure projects, including new roads and high-speed rail lines.

But what Russia really needs to modernise and diversify its economy, raise productivity, and move to a sustainably higher growth path is not a monetary or fiscal stimulus, but structural reforms to unleash the private sector and entrepreneurship. A survey in a leading newspaper has suggested that barely 4% of young Russians want a career in business. The SME sector is small by international standards. The reforms required include an improved business and investment climate (including stronger rule of law and less corruption), increased labour productivity, a reduced role of the state (which has grown to encompass around 50% of the economy, compared to around 20% in 2000), and greater levels of competition.

Policymakers, including President Putin and his closest advisers, regularly speak in support of this essential reform agenda, the importance of attracting foreign investment, and the need to support Russian SMEs. Business is beginning to see some modest improvements to some areas, such as tax administration and bureaucratic processes. Russia moved up 20 positions into the top 100 countries in the 2014 World Bank 'Doing Business' Survey. However, measures to improve the business climate are unlikely to make much difference in the absence of the more difficult structural reforms. Russia finally joined the WTO last year but has not fully implemented its accession commitments and has raised new barriers: the EU launched its first WTO complaint against Russia for discrimination against imported vehicles. The long-awaited resumption of privatisation has again been scaled back, while the energy sector has seen further state-led consolidation.

Some policymakers believe that Russia can rely on its enormous commodity reserves and avoid the pain of difficult structural reforms. If Russia is prepared to accept continued sub-optimal growth and vulnerability to swings in global commodity prices, this may perhaps be true. But downside risks are emerging. Continued weakness in the world economy coupled with ongoing changes in the demand and supply sides of the global energy market could result in a weakening of the central pillar supporting the Russian economy. Russia's balanced budget and current account surplus may both swing into the red in the coming years: a "double deficit", coupled with continuing outflows of private capital, would leave Russia uncomfortably exposed to the rigours of international capital markets. And demographic trends are now turning seriously adverse: the labour force will soon start shrinking by 1 million a year.

What does this mean for our commercial prospects? Russia was one of the UK's fastest growing major export markets in 2012, and became our 12th largest market for goods exports, ahead of all the other BRICS except China. Russia's slowdown will inevitably have an impact on the growth of our exports here. But a Russian economy growing at 2-3% still offers many opportunities. Foreign goods and services remain in high demand. And, even in a slower economy, there remains scope for winning market share from our major EU competitors, provided that we continue to push our case.



Ed is now booked to travel to Moscow on 4-6 December. I've attached an initial draft of his itinerary.

Are you able to help with identifying ways to fill his time on the Friday? We'll have approx 9am-4pm available for meetings so I'm hoping to get about 4-5 into his schedule.

Ed's priority is to meet with potential property investors. The Embassy hopes to get 8 such people around the table for dinner on Wednesday evening and they've asked if we have anyone in mind. Are we able to suggest anyone to the Embassy who we think could be interested in investing in London property, and whom we'd like to encourage to do so? has raised this with JLL's Russia office who were initially sceptical, but have said they'll continue thinking and come back to me.

For the Friday, the Embassy will speak to the Russo-British Chamber of Commerce about the possibility of them hosting a lunch/meeting that day. I'm also going to put in a request for Ed to meet with the Deputy Mayor of Moscow responsible for international relations.

Beyond that, do you have any sense of opportunities there for Ed to promote London's strengths in FS and EHQs or other key sectors? We don't think Ed will be keen to do anything around tourism, education, culture etc. As a starter for ten, do you have any thoughts on possible meetings with the following?

- SWFs: National Welfare Fund, Reserve Fund, Russian Direct Investment Fund
- Moscow International Business Centre / other HVOs ?
- Any Russian or British banks working there? Last week I joined a meeting with Makushin Yuri, Head of the Representative Office in the UK of Vnesheconombank (State Corporation Bank for Development and Foreign Economic Affairs). Do you think it's worth discussing Ed's trip with them?

Finally, be aware that Ed will be joined on the Forum's plenary panel by the Mayors of Moscow and Istanbul and Joko Widodo, the Governor of Jakarta. As we've previously invited the Governor of Jakarta to London to meet with Boris we're going to write again asking for a meeting whilst Ed and he are both in Moscow. Even if a meeting can't be arranged, I'll no doubt come to you for advice/briefing on what we'd like Ed to raise with him as they will both definitely have a chance to speak at the Forum.

Below is some background on this year's event. I've also listed some key speaking points given to the Mayor for his video message. Happy to speak tomorrow about further material needed.



3rd Moscow Urban Forum 2013

The Moscow Urban Forum has established itself as an international event for discussions between some of world's most acknowledged experts in city planning and urban development. Discussions focus on the opportunities and challenges that are vital for modern megacities not only in the context of economy and efficient management, but through the eyes of individual citizens.

This year's theme is "Megacities: Success Beyond the Centre". The overwhelming majority of the Moscow population lives outside the city centre, so the development of the suburbs is crucial in improving the lives of most people in the city. Day 1 will look at the experience of world cities, and Day 2 at Moscow, where the Moscow City Government needs to address questions like: How to create or increase the value of the suburbs? How to deal with transport issues? How to choose the most appropriate development strategy consistent with modern realities? Where to look for growth areas: in the so-called New Moscow, the old residential districts, the industrial zones or the satellite cities?

Speaking points

- We are planning for the largest population growth the city has seen in over 100 years. To do that, we need to manage the development, regeneration and local economy of a large area outside the central core of the city
- The Mayor has published a specific outer London development strategy to ensure that the high streets, community centres and local areas across London's boroughs, played a key role in London's economic success.
- To meet the challenges we face as a city, we have to realise the housing potential of outer London's town centres and improving the offer of outer London's trading estates
- And what do you need to do this?
 - First and foremost you need investment in transport infrastructure to unlock the development potential of brownfield sites outside the centre;
 - second, you need to be openly banging the drum for investment and create conditions that encourage the private sector to invest;
 - o and third, we've worked closely and cooperate with locally-elected councils to drive this regeneration



Thought you had already received this information? I think you asked me to find info for Q1-3. Will this suffice?

- 1. Similarities: London and Moscow are both the economic and political centres of each country, both accounting for a large chunk of GDP and economic growth, roughly similar size (Moscow is 1-2m more people) but the key thing is that both have growing populations and are therefore challenged with providing more housing, more transport capacity and encourage growth in key sectors in order to provide more jobs. Both have transport systems that move millions of people every day. Differences: London is the world's leading financial centre, which is something Moscow wants to emulate with its Moscow International Finance Centre. This is an area in which Moscow and London collaborates TheCityUK provides advice and assistance. Also, car usage in Moscow is such that the city regularly experiences severe traffic jams and, although car use in London is still high, London doesn't experience jams on the same scale (eg. it can take 3 hours to leave the city in the evening, esp. Friday nights when everyone goes out to their Dachas in the countryside).
- 3Big Moscow the background to this is that the Moscow city limits have been extended, almost doubling the size of the city. This gives the Mayor power over a much extended area and, its proponents argue, will provide space for new residential and employment areas. Much of the area is currently green space so the key challenge would be how you build knew urban areas spaces whilst preserving some of this green space and integrating them into the original urban fabric of the city.

The dinner could be preceded by a private briefing by HMA to Sir Edward about the UK's relations with Russia and the commercial opportunities, as well as a discussion of timing options for the Mayor's potential visit in 2014. It would be useful to know how many people from your side might accompany Sir Edward to the dinner: we would be hoping to keep it quite intimate.

We will wait to hear what (if any) help you need from us regarding meetings in Moscow on 5 and 6 December. 

Many apologies for my radio silence yet again - we've just got our first wave of people onto Beijing-bound flights this afternoon, so my involvement with the Mayor's trip to China should finally be coming to an end. This means that I hope to focus properly on Sir Edward's visit to Moscow next week.

The good news is that we're very close to booking flights - I'm 99% sure we'll be on BA233 on Weds 4th (dep. 0840 arr. 1610) and then returning to London on Friday 6th on BA234 (dep. 19:25 arr. 19:35). I've attached a draft itinerary based on these travels times.




We appreciate that you are probably overloaded with the Mayor's upcoming visit to China. When it is over, perhaps you could let us know your latest thinking on Sir Edward's visit to Moscow in early December, as well as the timing of the Mayor's visit to Russia in 2014 (in view of the difficulty identified in my last message). Thanks!



Thanks, Good that we are taking this forward now.

- * We (probably my colleague will arrange HM Ambassador 's dinner for Sir Edward and Russian investors on the evening of Weds 4 December at the Residence. Though we will not start working on that event until about a month before it takes place.
- * We note that you may arrive in Moscow on the afternoon of Tues 3 or Weds 4. We'd like to be clear, before you finalise your travel plans, exactly what you are expecting from the embassy in terms of arranging meetings. I think that our main contribution will be the dinner with Russian investors, and some engagement with UK investors in Russia. We'd be assuming that you will organise the meeting with the Moscow mayoralty and any other activities.
- * The new UKTI operation to promote Russian investment in the UK should hopefully be operational in Moscow by the end of October.
- * We note that you will not visit St Petersburg in December.

And now some bad news, I'm afraid, on the Mayor of London's proposed visit next June. Mansion House has now confirmed that the Lord Mayor and her delegation (who make an annual visit here in the late spring) are coming on 29 June to 2 July. We strongly advise you therefore to identify alternative dates for the Mayor's visit. We very much hope that the Mayor can visit Moscow next year, but we will simply not have the resource at the embassy to service two visits in close succession. More importantly, there is a real risk of sowing confusion in Moscow about the respective roles of our two London Mayors.



Thanks so much for coming back to me so quickly. Very quick update from me:

- * I think Ed would welcome meeting potential Russian investors over dinner on 4 December. Do you need anything from me in order to take that forward?
- * I'll check the price of the hotels you suggest and let you know if we need any further suggestions. The Forum may also have a partner hotel so will ask the organisers.
- * I'm trying to get to the point of confirming when we'll fly to Moscow fairly soon, so will have an idea then as to whether we'll be in Moscow from the afternoon of Tuesday 3rd or afternoon of Wednesday 4th.
- * The new UKTI operation in Moscow sounds like it'd be a good resource. Do you know when they'll be up and running?
- * For the Mayor's trip, we're constrained by a nightmare diary as to when we might get the Mayor out, and 24-27 June is currently looking like the only days available. Personally I agree the St Petersburg Economic Forum would be a perfect platform so perhaps let's hope they make a decision on that soon and I can go back to the Mayor's private office. As for the Lord Mayor's visit, we'd certainly look to de-conflict so if you hear any more on the dates the new Lord Mayor will visit please let me know.



Thanks for your quick reply. Taking your questions in order:

- * The guests to the 4 December dinner would, we recommend, be either prospective Russian investors in London, or alternatively UK exporters and investors in Russia.
- * Depending on the dinner guests on 4 December, we could help you set up meetings with other target companies in Moscow on 5 and 6 December.
- * Purely indicatively at this stage, the list of potential Russian investors in London might include: Russian Venture Capital, VTB Bank, Rusnano, Stalfond Pension Fund, Alfa Banking Group, Russian Railways, Elecard Group, and Kaspersky Lab. UKTI has not historically had an operation in Moscow targeting Russian investors in the UK, but it is in the process of creating such an operation using a respected outsourced partner. This new operation should be up & running well ahead of the December visit and will help us further refine the target investors for your visit.
- * Purely indicatively at this stage, the list of UK exporters & investors with a Moscow presence might include: BP, Shell, GSK, Astra Zeneca, Barclays, HSBC, RBS and Airbus. The Deputy Mayor should also probably meet the Russo-British Chamber of Commerce and the Association of European Businesses.
- * Moscow hotels near the Kremlin are the Ritz-Carlton, National and Metropole. They are all quite expensive. Come back to me if you need cheaper options (but they will be less central).
- * The St Petersburg element of the programme would be focused on urban regeneration. There is not a sufficiently large group of outward investors in St Petersburg to create a visit with an investment focus. So you may want to drop this idea.
- * On the Mayor's visit in 2014, I am afraid that there may be problems with the dates you have in mind. Firstly, there is considerable uncertainty around the timing of the annual St Petersburg Economic Forum, which traditionally takes place around 21 June but may move next year to other dates, due to the Russia-hosted G8 Summit in June. We think that the St Petersburg Forum would be a good platform for the Mayor. Secondly, the annual visit to Moscow of the Lord Mayor of London takes place in May or June, and Mansion House are currently working on dates in late June. We first need clarity on the Forum dates, and then try to de-conflict the Mayor and Lord Mayor's visits. Can we come back to this issue a little later in the year?

Dear

Thank you very much for your email today and many apologies for not having come back to you following your previous email on 6 August (!) - unfortunately August has proved to be incredibly busy here at City Hall as the Mayor will visit China next month which, coupled with some annual leave, means I'm still behind on my emails. However, a month to reply is unacceptable so please accept my apologies again.

I must admit we've not yet been able to significantly progress our plans/thoughts for Sir Edward's trip to Russia as we've been preoccupied with China. However, the following summarises where we are at present:

Flights

We've not yet decided whether we'll fly into Moscow on Tuesday 3rd or Wednesday 4th. If the former then we'd look to schedule meetings with the Moscow Mayoralty and others for the Wednesday. If the latter then I think we'd have to remain in Moscow for meetings on the Friday for meetings and fly back from there, rather than travel to Saint Petersburg. See below for more on St Petersburg.

If we fly into Moscow on the Wednesday then, absolutely, we will catch the flight arriving at 16:10 so that Sir Edward can be at the residence at a suitable time.

Itinerary

Many thanks for reserving the evening of 4 December in the Ambassador's diary for a dinner with Sir Edward, that's much appreciated. Could you let me know who you might invite to the dinner if it were to be opened up to other guests?

In terms of other meetings, our focus would be on the following:

- representative of the Moscow Mayoralty, which is something I can do with my existing contacts, although I will obviously wait until after this coming weekend to do so
- potential investors into London
- existing investors into London that we should pay a courtesy call on though identifying those companies may well be a question more for us than yourselves
- London/British businesses investing in Moscow/Russia.
- British-Russian business groups/associations

Do you have any thoughts? More than happy to have a conversation on the phone about this if easier?

Accommodation

Many thanks for the kind offer of trying to secure a room at the Ambassador's residence but I think we will stay at a hotel rather than impress upon the Ambassador, especially as there are functions on both 5th and 6th. Is there a hotel you direct inward delegations towards? The Forum is taking place near the Kremlin so a central hotel would be best, although I also know from experience that Moscow hotels are expensive so would welcome your advice.

Saint Petersburg

Thanks also for the e-introduction to and and As above, whether we can visit St Petersurg will be determined partly by when we can fly in but also as to whether there are useful relationships to build there. If we are able to visit both cities my hunch is that Sir Edward would prefer to concentrate on investment leads rather than urban regeneration, though I will doublecheck that. Are there businesses/potential investors it would be worth us meeting with in St Petersburg or are they largely located in Moscow?

Mayor's visit

For info, we are now holding time in the Mayor's diary for his own visit from 24-27 June 2014. If you've any initial comments or concerns about that time please let me know. As I think we'd discussed previously we'd use Sir

Edward's visit as a recce and an opportunity to build/warm relationships and discussions which the Mayor can then follow up when he visits, if that helps with determining who it'd be worth Sir Edward meeting in December.

Many thanks again for your help let me know if easier to speak on the phone.

Dear -

If you are still interested, shall we resume our correspondence about Sir Edward Lister's visit to Moscow (and maybe St Petersburg) in early December?

I have reserved the evening of Weds 4 December in the ambassador's diary and at his residence, for a possible dinner between the ambassador and Sir Edward, to which we would, if Sir Edward wishes, also invite outside guests. If we are to have outside guests to this dinner, it would be preferable if Sir Edward arrives on the BA flight that lands at 4.10pm rather than the flight that lands at 6.05pm, as it takes about 2 hours to clear immigration and travel to the city centre.

It may be possible for Sir Edward and up to 3 accompanying officials to say 1 or more nights at the ambassador's residence, though we do have functions at the residence on the evenings of 5 and 6 December.

We assume that Sir Edward's main interests in Moscow (outside the Urban Forum he is attending) are to meet the Moscow Mayoralty (which you are probably best placed to arrange?) and to meet potential Russian investors in London. But please let us know if Sir Edward has other interests, eg around urban planning or environmental cooperation, so we can consult the relevant colleagues here.

My colleagues at the British consulate in St Petersburg would be happy to arrange a half-day programme for Sir Edward in St Petersburg. The theme would be urban regeneration, rather than inward investment. The train journey from Moscow to St Petersburg takes about 4 hours, and there is one daily direct BA flight from St Petersburg to London, departing at around 6pm. So it might be possible, for example, to take the 6.45am train from Moscow to St Petersburg on 6 December, spend from 11am to 3.30pm at meetings in St Petersburg, and then catch the evening flight.

Looking forward to hearing your latest thinking on this visit. I am copying to my colleagues in St Petersburg who will be helping with this visit.

Thanks, Regarding Sir Edward's visit in December, I need to consult various colleagues in Moscow and St Petersburg (some of whom are on holiday), and I will aim to reply more fully by the end of next week. But perhaps I could bounce some initial thoughts off you.

- * I see no problem in principle between arranging a dinner for Sir Edward with HM Ambassador Tim Barrow on the evening of 4 December, probably at the ambassador's residence. I wonder whether Sir Edward might be interested in enlarging the dinner to include a number of carefully chosen Russian investors, or whether Sir Edward would prefer to meet Russian investors separately?
- * It may be possible for Sir Edward to say at the ambassador's residence (an imposing mansion opposite the Kremlin) during his stay: though I need to check the availability of guest rooms. Might this be of interest to Sir Edward, or would he prefer to use a hotel? Will Sir Edward be accompanied by anyone else from London on this trip?
- * I think that Sir Edward should certainly aim to meet his counterpart at the Moscow Mayoralty, though I suggest you wait until after the 8 September Moscow elections before trying to arrange anything.
- * It might well be possible to add on a worthwhile short visit to St Petersburg. The fastest trains between the 2 cities take 4 hours, and tend to depart in the early morning, at lunchtime and in the evening. There is one daily direct BA flight between London and St Petersburg. I am asking my colleagues in St Petersburg to identify programme elements for a possible visit.
- * I think we should be careful to distinguish the London Mayoralty carefully from the Lord Mayor of London's functions, as our Russian counterparts could easily be confused. The Lord Mayor not only travels to Moscow once a year (generally in the summer) with a financial services business delegation, but he also hosts in London a meeting every December with the Russians to discuss our bilateral financial services collaboration. As Sir Edward's visit to Moscow will take place just before the next meeting of the Lord Mayor's group in London, I would like to suggest we steer Sir Edward clear of the Russian financial services industry (simply to avoid any crossed wires and confusion).
- * It sounds as if Sir Edward's main focus will be on attracting Russian investment to London. Is that right? Or are there areas of urban planning (including perhaps sustainable transport, energy efficiency, environmental issues) that he might want to pursue here?

Sorry for my delayed response but many thanks for your respective emails - the information below is very useful. The Mayor's Private Office is reviewing his diary for 2014 so I'll let you know as and when they come back to me with some dates - they're aware of the points below and will factor that in.

However, it would be great if we could go ahead and schedule a meeting between Sir Edward and the Ambassador this December. The draft itinerary I'm working to at the moment is as follows:

Weds 4th: Fly to Moscow (arr. 16:10) Thurs 5th: Attend Moscow Urban Forum

Fri 6th: Meetings in Moscow; return to London (dep 17:50 or 19:25)

Would the Ambassador have availability to meet Sir Edward on the evening of Wednesday 4th, perhaps over dinner? I think it would be good for Ed to meet him before the Forum on Thursday, if at all possible.

Do you also have any recommendations for who else it would be worth him meeting with while in Moscow? I think his priority would be meetings with the following:

- Any Russian businesses that may want to invest in London or setup an office here
- people involved with high value opportunities in Russia that London businesses could bid for work on
- investment funds/authorities that we could encourage to invest in London
- a Deputy Mayor of Moscow (Andrei Sharonov has sent him an official invitation letter so I guess protocol would suggest we meet with him?)
- Russian businesses/investment funds that are existing investors in London
- tours of large-scale developments/HVOs

Depending on what the opportunity is for meetings in Moscow we could fly in on Tuesday 3rd and hold those meetings on Weds 4th, which could then free up Fri 6th for meetings in Saint Petersburg if there's sufficient opportunity there too. As such, any steer you have on what Sir Edward may be able to do in Saint Petersbirg would be gratefully received.

I hope that makes sense - if not please let me know.

Good to hear from you again. We note that the Mayor will definitely not be travelling to Sochi for the Winter Olympic (or Paralympic) Games.

We would warmly welcome a visit by the Mayor to Moscow (and St Petersburg) at some other time next year. However, the month of June is currently a bit problematic, though hopefully the picture may be clearer by this autumn.

The key point is that Russia will chair the G8 next year, and it will host the Summit of G8 leaders on 4-5 June in Sochi. So early June for a Mayoral visit can be excluded already, as the Russians (and we!) will be totally preoccupied with the G8 Summit.


There are a number of other events in May and June 2014 which might potentially be a centrepiece of a Mayoral visit. These include the annual St Petersburg International Economic Forum (the "Russian Davos") traditionally around 19-21 June (which would be an excellent speaking platform for the Mayor); the St Petersburg International Legal Forum, traditionally in the 3rd week of May; and the British embassy Moscow's Queen's Birthday Party reception sometime in late May or June.

President Putin has however indicated that the (normally entirely predictable) timing of the St Petersburg International Economic Forum may well change in 2014, in view of Russia's G8 Summit, with implications also for the Legal Forum and our Queen's Birthday Party. It is still very unclear how the choreography of events next June will run. We do not expect any decisions from the Kremlin until this autumn.


I should also mention that the Lord Mayor of London always visits Moscow every year in May or June (and, for the above reasons, we have been unable to propose firm dates to Mansion House for the 2014 visit): we would need to de-conflict the Mayor's from the Lord Mayor's visit.

Complicated!

Can we come back to Mayoral visit timing in the autumn? Meanwhile, British ambassador to Russia Tim Barrow would very much like to meet Sir Edward Lister during his December visit to Moscow to discuss a 2014 Mayoral visit: and I am wondering whether we can already identify a date and time for them to meet in Moscow in December?



Subject: Mayor of London - potential visit to Russia



I hope you're all well. Following our conversation about a month ago I wanted to bring you up to speed on the Mayor's plans for visiting Russia.

We've now made a number of decisions about when the Mayor will visit, as follows:

- The Mayor will no longer visit Moscow or Sochi before or for the Sochi Games. Thanks for any consideration you'd put in for Boris to visit around the Games and sorry if that has caused any needless inconvenience.

- We are now looking to find time in Boris' diary for a future visit, with tentative thoughts this may be sometime in June.
- We've declined Boris' participation at the 3rd Moscow Urban Forum (5-7 Dec) but have instead asked to send our Chief of Staff and Deputy Mayor for Policy and Planning, Sir Edward Lister. The organisers of the Forum have confirmed they'd be happy for Ed to participate so I'll soon be looking at preparations for that.
- We are considering whether the Mayor would visit both Moscow and then Saint Petersburg rather than travel for a visit to Moscow alone. If he were to do both then Ed would probably visit both in December.

Letters went from Boris to the Mayor of Moscow and the Russian Ambassador about a week ago - sorry again it has taken me so long to notify you.

As we discussed previously, the Mayor would want to use his visit to showcase London in Russia as the best city in Europe for FDI, for businesses to setup HQs, for tourists to visit and students to study in, as well as address any misconceptions or views of London in Russia (eg. the Mayor's trip to China will try to improve views of London as inventive and cutting edge and not focus on heritage). I'd of course very much welcome any help you'd be able to offer with regard to coping a programme for both the Mayor's planned visit next year and Ed's visit in December, as we tend to use an advance visit by Ed as a recce, to establish relationships with political, business and other leaders locally and to warm up potential discussions/deals for when the Mayor visits.

If you've any suggestions or recommendations at this stage - especially dates we might want to focus on or avoid for the Mayor's visit itself - then they'd be very gratefully received. And if a further telecon would help then please let me know and I'll set one up.

As per my email below I'd welcome your views on Friday regarding how this would work/fit-in with your VIP programme; what opportunity there would be for the Mayor to gain time with Government/business people in Moscow and/or Sochi; and whether it would be best to visit Moscow before or after visiting Sochi.
- * it's good to know of the BBE in January and it would be useful to speak more about this on Friday. I'm fairly sure there's no scope to move the trip to Jan but happy to look at the prospect once we've spoken.

Sir Edward has forwarded to me email offer of help to develop a programme that will promote London's commercial/cultural/policy interests. This is certainly something we'd be looking to do so would be able to join the teleconference on Friday?

I am UKTI Team Leader for Sport and was introduced to you via e-mail by UKTI Specialist/HVO. It is good to know that you have already commenced looking at possible dates /itinerary for the Mayor's potential visit to Russia.

I am also aware that our economic team (Economic Counsellor, British Embassy, Moscow) has been in correspondence with Sir Edward Lister, Chief of Staff and Deputy Mayor for Policy and Planning, who informed us earlier in May that the Mayor was considering an invitation from the Mayor of Moscow for 5 /6 December.

Could you please clarify whether the Mayor plans to come to Russia twice or whether you are now only considering a possibility of building the visit around the Sochi Games Opening Ceremony. The time around the games will be very busy for us, as we are likely to have a number of other UK VIP visitors to the Sochi Games in February and, in view of the very limited resources available to us on the ground in Sochi, we would need to coordinate the Mayoral visit carefully with other planned VIP visits.

Alternatively the Mayor might want to time his visit to the British Business Embassy week we plan in Moscow, in January before the Winter Olympics start. Please find below the details of the BBE programme in Moscow:

Moscow: 20 - 28 January 2014

The British Business Embassy Moscow will take place in HMA's Residence. It will comprise of a number of events over 5 - 7 days. Using the Olympic Legacy theme, and showcasing our contribution to Sochi 2014, the BBE will highlight the best of British business, design and technology across all sectors covered by UKTI Russia. The centre piece of the BBE, under the Sport is GREAT banner, will be events on the first two days to highlight the UK's contribution to the success of Sochi 2014. Some of the 50 British businesses that worked on Sochi 2014 will

host panel discussions, workshops and networking receptions to showcase their contribution to Sochi 2014, exchange views and ideas, discuss challenges and develop strong global partnerships.

After the Sport is GREAT events, the BBE will host GREAT-branded seminars and networking receptions across all sectors covered by UKTI Russia.

Hosting the BBE in Moscow would allow us to reach a large, high quality business and political audience and ensure widespread press coverage. The UK's contribution to Sochi will be "front of mind" with business partners during the two weeks of the Games and we estimate that the BBE will generate at least 100 significant assists for each UKTI Russia team.



Subject: RE: Deputy Mayor of London's visit to Moscow Thanks, We are working on the basis that we will organise for HM Ambassador Tim Barrow to host a dinner at his Residence on 4 December for Sir Edward to meet actual and potential Russian investors in London. The dinner could be preceded by a private briefing by HMA to Sir Edward about the UK's relations with Russia and the commercial opportunities, as well as a discussion of timing options for the Mayor's potential visit in 2014. It would be useful to know how many people from your side might accompany Sir Edward to the dinner: we would be hoping to keep it quite intimate.

We will wait to hear what (if any) help you need from us regarding meetings in Moscow on 5 and 6 December. We assume that you will organise visas, accommodation and transport for Sir Edward and his delegation for the full duration of the visit. We recommend early application for visas (in consultation with the Urban Forum organisers, who will presumably issue a letter of invitation); and please bear in mind that it takes a minimum of 90 minutes to travel by road between the airport and city-centre (traffic jams are frequent).




If you have any initial thoughts on this please let me know, but at any rate I'll be in touch early next week to discuss Sir Edward's visit with you.


We appreciate that you are probably overloaded with the Mayor's upcoming visit to China. When it is over, perhaps you could let us know your latest thinking on Sir Edward's visit to Moscow in early December, as well as the timing of the Mayor's visit to Russia in 2014 (in view of the difficulty identified in my last message). Thanks!



Thanks, Good that we are taking this forward now.

- * We (probably my colleague will arrange HM Ambassador 's dinner for Sir Edward and Russian investors on the evening of Weds 4 December at the Residence. Though we will not start working on that event until about a month before it takes place.
- * We note that you may arrive in Moscow on the afternoon of Tues 3 or Weds 4. We'd like to be clear, before you finalise your travel plans, exactly what you are expecting from the embassy in terms of arranging meetings. I think that our main contribution will be the dinner with Russian investors, and some engagement with UK investors in Russia. We'd be assuming that you will organise the meeting with the Moscow mayoralty and any other activities.
- * The new UKTI operation to promote Russian investment in the UK should hopefully be operational in Moscow by the end of October.
- * We note that you will not visit St Petersburg in December.

And now some bad news, I'm afraid, on the Mayor of London's proposed visit next June. Mansion House has now confirmed that the Lord Mayor and her delegation (who make an annual visit here in the late spring) are coming on 29 June to 2 July. We strongly advise you therefore to identify alternative dates for the Mayor's visit. We very much hope that the Mayor can visit Moscow next year, but we will simply not have the resource at the embassy to service two visits in close succession. More importantly, there is a real risk of sowing confusion in Moscow about the respective roles of our two London Mayors.



Thanks so much for coming back to me so quickly. Very quick update from me:

- * I think Ed would welcome meeting potential Russian investors over dinner on 4 December. Do you need anything from me in order to take that forward?
- * I'll check the price of the hotels you suggest and let you know if we need any further suggestions. The Forum may also have a partner hotel so will ask the organisers.
- * I'm trying to get to the point of confirming when we'll fly to Moscow fairly soon, so will have an idea then as to whether we'll be in Moscow from the afternoon of Tuesday 3rd or afternoon of Wednesday 4th.
- * The new UKTI operation in Moscow sounds like it'd be a good resource. Do you know when they'll be up and running?
- * For the Mayor's trip, we're constrained by a nightmare diary as to when we might get the Mayor out, and 24-27 June is currently looking like the only days available. Personally I agree the St Petersburg Economic Forum would be a perfect platform so perhaps let's hope they make a decision on that soon and I can go back to the Mayor's private office. As for the Lord Mayor's visit, we'd certainly look to de-conflict so if you hear any more on the dates the new Lord Mayor will visit please let me know.



Thanks for your quick reply. Taking your questions in order:

- * The guests to the 4 December dinner would, we recommend, be either prospective Russian investors in London, or alternatively UK exporters and investors in Russia.
- * Depending on the dinner guests on 4 December, we could help you set up meetings with other target companies in Moscow on 5 and 6 December.
- * Purely indicatively at this stage, the list of potential Russian investors in London might include: Russian Venture Capital, VTB Bank, Rusnano, Stalfond Pension Fund, Alfa Banking Group, Russian Railways, Elecard Group, and Kaspersky Lab. UKTI has not historically had an operation in Moscow targeting Russian investors in the UK, but it is in the process of creating such an operation using a respected outsourced partner. This new operation should be up & running well ahead of the December visit and will help us further refine the target investors for your visit.
- * Purely indicatively at this stage, the list of UK exporters & investors with a Moscow presence might include: BP, Shell, GSK, Astra Zeneca, Barclays, HSBC, RBS and Airbus. The Deputy Mayor should also probably meet the Russo-British Chamber of Commerce and the Association of European Businesses.
- * Moscow hotels near the Kremlin are the Ritz-Carlton, National and Metropole. They are all quite expensive. Come back to me if you need cheaper options (but they will be less central).
- * The St Petersburg element of the programme would be focused on urban regeneration. There is not a sufficiently large group of outward investors in St Petersburg to create a visit with an investment focus. So you may want to drop this idea.
- * On the Mayor's visit in 2014, I am afraid that there may be problems with the dates you have in mind. Firstly, there is considerable uncertainty around the timing of the annual St Petersburg Economic Forum, which traditionally takes place around 21 June but may move next year to other dates, due to the Russia-hosted G8 Summit in June. We think that the St Petersburg Forum would be a good platform for the Mayor. Secondly, the annual visit to Moscow of the Lord Mayor of London takes place in May or June, and Mansion House are currently working on dates in late June. We first need clarity on the Forum dates, and then try to de-conflict the Mayor and Lord Mayor's visits. Can we come back to this issue a little later in the year?

Dear

Thank you very much for your email today and many apologies for not having come back to you following your previous email on 6 August (!) - unfortunately August has proved to be incredibly busy here at City Hall as the Mayor will visit China next month which, coupled with some annual leave, means I'm still behind on my emails. However, a month to reply is unacceptable so please accept my apologies again.

I must admit we've not yet been able to significantly progress our plans/thoughts for Sir Edward's trip to Russia as we've been preoccupied with China. However, the following summarises where we are at present:

Flights

We've not yet decided whether we'll fly into Moscow on Tuesday 3rd or Wednesday 4th. If the former then we'd look to schedule meetings with the Moscow Mayoralty and others for the Wednesday. If the latter then I think we'd have to remain in Moscow for meetings on the Friday for meetings and fly back from there, rather than travel to Saint Petersburg. See below for more on St Petersburg.

If we fly into Moscow on the Wednesday then, absolutely, we will catch the flight arriving at 16:10 so that Sir Edward can be at the residence at a suitable time.

Itinerary

Many thanks for reserving the evening of 4 December in the Ambassador's diary for a dinner with Sir Edward, that's much appreciated. Could you let me know who you might invite to the dinner if it were to be opened up to other guests?

In terms of other meetings, our focus would be on the following:

- representative of the Moscow Mayoralty, which is something I can do with my existing contacts, although I will obviously wait until after this coming weekend to do so
- potential investors into London
- existing investors into London that we should pay a courtesy call on though identifying those companies may well be a question more for us than yourselves
- London/British businesses investing in Moscow/Russia.
- British-Russian business groups/associations

Do you have any thoughts? More than happy to have a conversation on the phone about this if easier?

Accommodation

Many thanks for the kind offer of trying to secure a room at the Ambassador's residence but I think we will stay at a hotel rather than impress upon the Ambassador, especially as there are functions on both 5th and 6th. Is there a hotel you direct inward delegations towards? The Forum is taking place near the Kremlin so a central hotel would be best, although I also know from experience that Moscow hotels are expensive so would welcome your advice.

Saint Petersburg

Thanks also for the e-introduction to and and As above, whether we can visit St Petersurg will be determined partly by when we can fly in but also as to whether there are useful relationships to build there. If we are able to visit both cities my hunch is that Sir Edward would prefer to concentrate on investment leads rather than urban regeneration, though I will doublecheck that. Are there businesses/potential investors it would be worth us meeting with in St Petersburg or are they largely located in Moscow?

Mayor's visit

For info, we are now holding time in the Mayor's diary for his own visit from 24-27 June 2014. If you've any initial comments or concerns about that time please let me know. As I think we'd discussed previously we'd use Sir

Edward's visit as a recce and an opportunity to build/warm relationships and discussions which the Mayor can then follow up when he visits, if that helps with determining who it'd be worth Sir Edward meeting in December.

Many thanks again for your help let me know if easier to speak on the phone.

If you are still interested, shall we resume our correspondence about Sir Edward Lister's visit to Moscow (and maybe St Petersburg) in early December?

I have reserved the evening of Weds 4 December in the ambassador's diary and at his residence, for a possible dinner between the ambassador and Sir Edward, to which we would, if Sir Edward wishes, also invite outside guests. If we are to have outside guests to this dinner, it would be preferable if Sir Edward arrives on the BA flight that lands at 4.10pm rather than the flight that lands at 6.05pm, as it takes about 2 hours to clear immigration and travel to the city centre.

It may be possible for Sir Edward and up to 3 accompanying officials to say 1 or more nights at the ambassador's residence, though we do have functions at the residence on the evenings of 5 and 6 December.

We assume that Sir Edward's main interests in Moscow (outside the Urban Forum he is attending) are to meet the Moscow Mayoralty (which you are probably best placed to arrange?) and to meet potential Russian investors in London. But please let us know if Sir Edward has other interests, eg around urban planning or environmental cooperation, so we can consult the relevant colleagues here.

My colleagues at the British consulate in St Petersburg would be happy to arrange a half-day programme for Sir Edward in St Petersburg. The theme would be urban regeneration, rather than inward investment. The train journey from Moscow to St Petersburg takes about 4 hours, and there is one daily direct BA flight from St Petersburg to London, departing at around 6pm. So it might be possible, for example, to take the 6.45am train from Moscow to St Petersburg on 6 December, spend from 11am to 3.30pm at meetings in St Petersburg, and then catch the evening flight.

Looking forward to hearing your latest thinking on this visit. I am copying to my colleagues in St Petersburg who will be helping with this visit.

Thanks, Regarding Sir Edward's visit in December, I need to consult various colleagues in Moscow and St Petersburg (some of whom are on holiday), and I will aim to reply more fully by the end of next week. But perhaps I could bounce some initial thoughts off you.

- * I see no problem in principle between arranging a dinner for Sir Edward with HM Ambassador Tim Barrow on the evening of 4 December, probably at the ambassador's residence. I wonder whether Sir Edward might be interested in enlarging the dinner to include a number of carefully chosen Russian investors, or whether Sir Edward would prefer to meet Russian investors separately?
- * It may be possible for Sir Edward to say at the ambassador's residence (an imposing mansion opposite the Kremlin) during his stay: though I need to check the availability of guest rooms. Might this be of interest to Sir Edward, or would he prefer to use a hotel? Will Sir Edward be accompanied by anyone else from London on this trip?
- * I think that Sir Edward should certainly aim to meet his counterpart at the Moscow Mayoralty, though I suggest you wait until after the 8 September Moscow elections before trying to arrange anything.
- * It might well be possible to add on a worthwhile short visit to St Petersburg. The fastest trains between the 2 cities take 4 hours, and tend to depart in the early morning, at lunchtime and in the evening. There is one daily direct BA flight between London and St Petersburg. I am asking my colleagues in St Petersburg to identify programme elements for a possible visit.
- * I think we should be careful to distinguish the London Mayoralty carefully from the Lord Mayor of London's functions, as our Russian counterparts could easily be confused. The Lord Mayor not only travels to Moscow once a year (generally in the summer) with a financial services business delegation, but he also hosts in London a meeting every December with the Russians to discuss our bilateral financial services collaboration. As Sir Edward's visit to Moscow will take place just before the next meeting of the Lord Mayor's group in London, I would like to suggest we steer Sir Edward clear of the Russian financial services industry (simply to avoid any crossed wires and confusion).
- * It sounds as if Sir Edward's main focus will be on attracting Russian investment to London. Is that right? Or are there areas of urban planning (including perhaps sustainable transport, energy efficiency, environmental issues) that he might want to pursue here?

Sorry for my delayed response but many thanks for your respective emails - the information below is very useful. The Mayor's Private Office is reviewing his diary for 2014 so I'll let you know as and when they come back to me with some dates - they're aware of the points below and will factor that in.

However, it would be great if we could go ahead and schedule a meeting between Sir Edward and the Ambassador this December. The draft itinerary I'm working to at the moment is as follows:

Weds 4th: Fly to Moscow (arr. 16:10) Thurs 5th: Attend Moscow Urban Forum

Fri 6th: Meetings in Moscow; return to London (dep 17:50 or 19:25)

Would the Ambassador have availability to meet Sir Edward on the evening of Wednesday 4th, perhaps over dinner? I think it would be good for Ed to meet him before the Forum on Thursday, if at all possible.

Do you also have any recommendations for who else it would be worth him meeting with while in Moscow? I think his priority would be meetings with the following:

- Any Russian businesses that may want to invest in London or setup an office here
- people involved with high value opportunities in Russia that London businesses could bid for work on
- investment funds/authorities that we could encourage to invest in London
- a Deputy Mayor of Moscow (Andrei Sharonov has sent him an official invitation letter so I guess protocol would suggest we meet with him?)
- Russian businesses/investment funds that are existing investors in London
- tours of large-scale developments/HVOs

Depending on what the opportunity is for meetings in Moscow we could fly in on Tuesday 3rd and hold those meetings on Weds 4th, which could then free up Fri 6th for meetings in Saint Petersburg if there's sufficient opportunity there too. As such, any steer you have on what Sir Edward may be able to do in Saint Petersbirg would be gratefully received.

I hope that makes sense - if not please let me know.

Good to hear from you again. We note that the Mayor will definitely not be travelling to Sochi for the Winter Olympic (or Paralympic) Games.

We would warmly welcome a visit by the Mayor to Moscow (and St Petersburg) at some other time next year. However, the month of June is currently a bit problematic, though hopefully the picture may be clearer by this autumn.

The key point is that Russia will chair the G8 next year, and it will host the Summit of G8 leaders on 4-5 June in Sochi. So early June for a Mayoral visit can be excluded already, as the Russians (and we!) will be totally preoccupied with the G8 Summit.


There are a number of other events in May and June 2014 which might potentially be a centrepiece of a Mayoral visit. These include the annual St Petersburg International Economic Forum (the "Russian Davos") traditionally around 19-21 June (which would be an excellent speaking platform for the Mayor); the St Petersburg International Legal Forum, traditionally in the 3rd week of May; and the British embassy Moscow's Queen's Birthday Party reception sometime in late May or June.

President Putin has however indicated that the (normally entirely predictable) timing of the St Petersburg International Economic Forum may well change in 2014, in view of Russia's G8 Summit, with implications also for the Legal Forum and our Queen's Birthday Party. It is still very unclear how the choreography of events next June will run. We do not expect any decisions from the Kremlin until this autumn.


I should also mention that the Lord Mayor of London always visits Moscow every year in May or June (and, for the above reasons, we have been unable to propose firm dates to Mansion House for the 2014 visit): we would need to de-conflict the Mayor's from the Lord Mayor's visit.

Complicated!

Can we come back to Mayoral visit timing in the autumn? Meanwhile, British ambassador to Russia Tim Barrow would very much like to meet Sir Edward Lister during his December visit to Moscow to discuss a 2014 Mayoral visit: and I am wondering whether we can already identify a date and time for them to meet in Moscow in December?



Subject: Mayor of London - potential visit to Russia



I hope you're all well. Following our conversation about a month ago I wanted to bring you up to speed on the Mayor's plans for visiting Russia.

We've now made a number of decisions about when the Mayor will visit, as follows:

- The Mayor will no longer visit Moscow or Sochi before or for the Sochi Games. Thanks for any consideration you'd put in for Boris to visit around the Games and sorry if that has caused any needless inconvenience.

- We are now looking to find time in Boris' diary for a future visit, with tentative thoughts this may be sometime in June.
- We've declined Boris' participation at the 3rd Moscow Urban Forum (5-7 Dec) but have instead asked to send our Chief of Staff and Deputy Mayor for Policy and Planning, Sir Edward Lister. The organisers of the Forum have confirmed they'd be happy for Ed to participate so I'll soon be looking at preparations for that.
- We are considering whether the Mayor would visit both Moscow and then Saint Petersburg rather than travel for a visit to Moscow alone. If he were to do both then Ed would probably visit both in December.

Letters went from Boris to the Mayor of Moscow and the Russian Ambassador about a week ago - sorry again it has taken me so long to notify you.

As we discussed previously, the Mayor would want to use his visit to showcase London in Russia as the best city in Europe for FDI, for businesses to setup HQs, for tourists to visit and students to study in, as well as address any misconceptions or views of London in Russia (eg. the Mayor's trip to China will try to improve views of London as inventive and cutting edge and not focus on heritage). I'd of course very much welcome any help you'd be able to offer with regard to coping a programme for both the Mayor's planned visit next year and Ed's visit in December, as we tend to use an advance visit by Ed as a recce, to establish relationships with political, business and other leaders locally and to warm up potential discussions/deals for when the Mayor visits.

If you've any suggestions or recommendations at this stage - especially dates we might want to focus on or avoid for the Mayor's visit itself - then they'd be very gratefully received. And if a further telecon would help then please let me know and I'll set one up.

It would be great to chat about this over the phone and i'm available all day on Friday for a teleconference - do you want to let me know what time is most convenient for you and the Embassy team?

On your questions:

- * we will very soon be declining Mayor Sobyanin's invitation for Boris to speak at the 3rd Moscow Urban Forum in December. Unfortunately the Mayor is unable to make it to Russia on either 5th or 6th but we are, as an alternative, proposing that Sir Edward Lister attends and speaks on the Mayor's behalf. Note that the letter hasn't gone out yet so neither the Mayor of Moscow's office nor the Russian Ambassador to the UK are yet aware of this situation.
- * as an alternative to visiting in December we're now looking at the one Mayoral trip to Moscow/Sochi around the time of the Opening Ceremony on 7 Feb. As per my email below I'd welcome your views on Friday regarding how this would work/fit-in with your VIP programme; what opportunity there would be for the Mayor to gain time with Government/business people in Moscow and/or Sochi; and whether it would be best to visit Moscow before or after visiting Sochi.
- * it's good to know of the BBE in January and it would be useful to speak more about this on Friday. I'm fairly sure there's no scope to move the trip to Jan but happy to look at the prospect once we've spoken.

Sir Edward has forwarded to me email offer of help to develop a programme that will promote London's commercial/cultural/policy interests. This is certainly something we'd be looking to do so would be able to join the teleconference on Friday?

I am UKTI Team Leader for Sport and was introduced to you via e-mail by UKTI Specialist/HVO. It is good to know that you have already commenced looking at possible dates /itinerary for the Mayor's potential visit to Russia.

I am also aware that our economic team (Economic Counsellor, British Embassy, Moscow) has been in correspondence with Sir Edward Lister, Chief of Staff and Deputy Mayor for Policy and Planning, who informed us earlier in May that the Mayor was considering an invitation from the Mayor of Moscow for 5 /6 December.

Could you please clarify whether the Mayor plans to come to Russia twice or whether you are now only considering a possibility of building the visit around the Sochi Games Opening Ceremony. The time around the games will be very busy for us, as we are likely to have a number of other UK VIP visitors to the Sochi Games in February and, in view of the very limited resources available to us on the ground in Sochi, we would need to coordinate the Mayoral visit carefully with other planned VIP visits.

Alternatively the Mayor might want to time his visit to the British Business Embassy week we plan in Moscow, in January before the Winter Olympics start. Please find below the details of the BBE programme in Moscow:

Moscow: 20 - 28 January 2014

The British Business Embassy Moscow will take place in HMA's Residence. It will comprise of a number of events over 5 - 7 days. Using the Olympic Legacy theme, and showcasing our contribution to Sochi 2014, the BBE will highlight the best of British business, design and technology across all sectors covered by UKTI Russia. The centre piece of the BBE, under the Sport is GREAT banner, will be events on the first two days to highlight the UK's contribution to the success of Sochi 2014. Some of the 50 British businesses that worked on Sochi 2014 will host panel discussions, workshops and networking receptions to showcase their contribution to Sochi 2014,

After the Sport is GREAT events, the BBE will host GREAT-branded seminars and networking receptions across all sectors covered by UKTI Russia.

Hosting the BBE in Moscow would allow us to reach a large, high quality business and political audience and ensure widespread press coverage. The UK's contribution to Sochi will be "front of mind" with business partners during the two weeks of the Games and we estimate that the BBE will generate at least 100 significant assists for each UKTI Russia team.

Finally, holding the BBE before Sochi will ensure it does not get "lost in the noise" of the Winter Olympics, and the branding of BBE events will not fall under the strict advertising restrictions imposed in Sochi. In addition, access for business partners and visitors will not be restricted.





I'm more than happy to help. To answer your question - the Mayor moves around London either by public transport or on his bicycle – he doesn't have an official car and therefore never requires the traffic to be stopped or roads to be blocked.

I don't know the official policy regarding the movement of the Queen or Prime Minister as the Mayor's Office is not involved with decisions to ensure high level officials can move around London. However, I can say that it's very unusual for roads to be blocked. The police may use motorcycle drivers to travel ahead of the high rank official's car to ensure there are no obstacles and to ensure that traffic is moving freely, and they may also temporarily stop traffic joining the route of the official's car in order to keep the route free, but that temporary stop would last no more than a minute. Road blocks lasting longer than a minute or two are very uncommon.

If there was an occasion when a Head of State (eg. President Obama) from another country was visiting then the police may block roads to ensure the protection of the official and to ensure the route was clear, but this would be assessed on a case by case basis and again isn't very common.

Thanks, Regarding Sir Edward's visit in December, I need to consult various colleagues in Moscow and St Petersburg (some of whom are on holiday), and I will aim to reply more fully by the end of next week. But perhaps I could bounce some initial thoughts off you.

- I see no problem in principle between arranging a dinner for Sir Edward with HM Ambassador Tim Barrow on the evening of 4 December, probably at the ambassador's residence. I wonder whether Sir Edward might be interested in enlarging the dinner to include a number of carefully chosen Russian investors, or whether Sir Edward would prefer to meet Russian investors separately?
- It may be possible for Sir Edward to say at the ambassador's residence (an imposing mansion opposite the Kremlin) during his stay: though I need to check the availability of guest rooms. Might this be of interest to Sir Edward, or would he prefer to use a hotel? Will Sir Edward be accompanied by anyone else from London on this trip?
- I think that Sir Edward should certainly aim to meet his counterpart at the Moscow Mayoralty, though I suggest you wait until after the 8 September Moscow elections before trying to arrange anything.
- It might well be possible to add on a worthwhile short visit to St Petersburg. The fastest trains between the 2 cities take 4 hours, and tend to depart in the early morning, at lunchtime and in the evening. There is one daily direct BA flight between London and St Petersburg. I am asking my colleagues in St Petersburg to identify programme elements for a possible visit.
- I think we should be careful to distinguish the London Mayoralty carefully from the Lord Mayor of London's functions, as our Russian counterparts could easily be confused. The Lord Mayor not only travels to Moscow once a year (generally in the summer) with a financial services business delegation, but he also hosts in London a meeting every December with the Russians to discuss our bilateral financial services collaboration. As Sir Edward's visit to Moscow will take place just before the next meeting of the Lord Mayor's group in London, I would like to suggest we steer Sir Edward clear of the Russian financial services industry (simply to avoid any crossed wires and confusion).
- It sounds as if Sir Edward's main focus will be on attracting Russian investment to London. Is that right? Or are there areas of urban planning (including perhaps sustainable transport, energy efficiency, environmental issues) that he might want to pursue here?

Sorry for my delayed response but many thanks for your respective emails - the information below is very useful. The Mayor's Private Office is reviewing his diary for 2014 so I'll let you know as and when they come back to me with some dates – they're aware of the points below and will factor that in.

However, it would be great if we could go ahead and schedule a meeting between Sir Edward and the Ambassador this December. The draft itinerary I'm working to at the moment is as follows:

Weds 4th: Fly to Moscow (arr. 16:10) Thurs 5th: Attend Moscow Urban Forum

Fri 6th: Meetings in Moscow; return to London (dep 17:50 or 19:25)

Would the Ambassador have availability to meet Sir Edward on the evening of Wednesday 4th, perhaps over dinner? I think it would be good for Ed to meet him before the Forum on Thursday, if at all possible.

Do you also have any recommendations for who else it would be worth him meeting with while in Moscow? I think his priority would be meetings with the following:

- Any Russian businesses that may want to invest in London or setup an office here
- people involved with high value opportunities in Russia that London businesses could bid for work on
- investment funds/authorities that we could encourage to invest in London
- a Deputy Mayor of Moscow (Andrei Sharonov has sent him an official invitation letter so I guess protocol would suggest we meet with him?)
- Russian businesses/investment funds that are existing investors in London
- tours of large-scale developments/HVOs

Depending on what the opportunity is for meetings in Moscow we could fly in on Tuesday 3rd and hold those meetings on Weds 4th, which could then free up Fri 6th for meetings in Saint Petersburg if there's sufficient opportunity there too. As such, any steer you have on what Sir Edward may be able to do in Saint Petersbirg would be gratefully received.

I hope that makes sense – if not please let me know.

Dear –

Good to hear from you again. We note that the Mayor will definitely <u>not</u> be travelling to Sochi for the Winter Olympic (or Paralympic) Games.

We would <u>warmly welcome</u> a visit by the Mayor to Moscow (and St Petersburg) at some other time next year. However, the month of June is currently a bit problematic, though hopefully the picture may be clearer by this autumn.

The key point is that Russia will chair the G8 next year, and it will host the Summit of G8 leaders on 4-5 June in Sochi. So early June for a Mayoral visit can be excluded already, as the Russians (and we!) will be totally preoccupied with the G8 Summit.

There are a number of other events in May and June 2014 which might potentially be a centrepiece of a Mayoral visit. These include the annual St Petersburg International Economic Forum (the "Russian Davos") traditionally around 19-21 June (which would be an excellent speaking platform for the Mayor); the St Petersburg International


Legal Forum, traditionally in the 3rd week of May; and the British embassy Moscow's Queen's Birthday Party reception sometime in late May or June.

President Putin has however indicated that the (normally entirely predictable) timing of the St Petersburg International Economic Forum may well change in 2014, in view of Russia's G8 Summit, with implications also for the Legal Forum and our Queen's Birthday Party. It is still very unclear how the choreography of events next June will run. We do not expect any decisions from the Kremlin until this autumn.

I should also mention that the Lord Mayor of London always visits Moscow every year in May or June (and, for the above reasons, we have been unable to propose firm dates to Mansion House for the 2014 visit): we would need to de-conflict the Mayor's from the Lord Mayor's visit.

Complicated!

Can we come back to Mayoral visit timing in the autumn? Meanwhile, British ambassador to Russia Tim Barrow would very much like to meet Sir Edward Lister during his December visit to Moscow to discuss a 2014 Mayoral visit: and I am wondering whether we can already identify a date and time for them to meet in Moscow in December?



I hope you're all well. Following our conversation about a month ago I wanted to bring you up to speed on the Mayor's plans for visiting Russia.

We've now made a number of decisions about when the Mayor will visit, as follows:

- The Mayor will no longer visit Moscow or Sochi before or for the Sochi Games. Thanks for any consideration you'd put in for Boris to visit around the Games and sorry if that has caused any needless inconvenience.
- We are now looking to find time in Boris' diary for a future visit, with tentative thoughts this may be sometime in June.
- We've declined Boris' participation at the 3rd Moscow Urban Forum (5-7 Dec) but have instead asked to send our Chief of Staff and Deputy Mayor for Policy and Planning, Sir Edward Lister. The organisers of the Forum have confirmed they'd be happy for Ed to participate so I'll soon be looking at preparations for that.
- We are considering whether the Mayor would visit both Moscow and then Saint Petersburg rather than travel for a visit to Moscow alone. If he were to do both then Ed would probably visit both in December.

Letters went from Boris to the Mayor of Moscow and the Russian Ambassador about a week ago – sorry again it has taken me so long to notify you.

As we discussed previously, the Mayor would want to use his visit to showcase London in Russia as the best city in Europe for FDI, for businesses to setup HQs, for tourists to visit and students to study in, as well as address any misconceptions or views of London in Russia (eg. the Mayor's trip to China will try to improve views of London as inventive and cutting edge and not focus on heritage). I'd of course very much welcome any help you'd be able to offer with regard to coping a programme for both the Mayor's planned visit next year and Ed's visit in December, as we tend to use an advance visit by Ed as a recce, to establish relationships with political, business and other leaders locally and to warm up potential discussions/deals for when the Mayor visits.

If you've any suggestions or recommendations at this stage - especially dates we might want to focus on or avoid for the Mayor's visit itself – then they'd be very gratefully received. And if a further telecon would help then please let me know and I'll set one up.

Thanks very much for your email and sorry for the slight delay coming back to you.

It would be great to chat about this over the phone and i'm available all day on Friday for a teleconference - do you want to let me know what time is most convenient for you and the Embassy team?

On your questions:

- we will very soon be declining Mayor Sobyanin's invitation for Boris to speak at the 3rd Moscow Urban Forum in December. Unfortunately the Mayor is unable to make it to Russia on either 5th or 6th but we are, as an alternative, proposing that Sir Edward Lister attends and speaks on the Mayor's behalf. Note that the letter hasn't gone out yet so neither the Mayor of Moscow's office nor the Russian Ambassador to the UK are yet aware of this situation.
- as an alternative to visiting in December we're now looking at the one Mayoral trip to Moscow/Sochi around
 the time of the Opening Ceremony on 7 Feb. As per my email below I'd welcome your views on Friday
 regarding how this would work/fit-in with your VIP programme; what opportunity there would be for the Mayor
 to gain time with Government/business people in Moscow and/or Sochi; and whether it would be best to visit
 Moscow before or after visiting Sochi.
- it's good to know of the BBE in January and it would be useful to speak more about this on Friday. I'm fairly sure there's no scope to move the trip to Jan but happy to look at the prospect once we've spoken.

Sir Edward has forwarded to me email offer of help to develop a programme that will promote London's commercial/cultural/policy interests. This is certainly something we'd be looking to do so would be able to join the teleconference on Friday?

I am UKTI Team Leader for Sport and was introduced to you via e-mail by UKTI Specialist/HVO. It is good to know that you have already commenced looking at possible dates /itinerary for the Mayor's potential visit to Russia.

I am also aware that our economic team (Economic Counsellor, British Embassy, Moscow) has been in correspondence with Sir Edward Lister, Chief of Staff and Deputy Mayor for Policy and Planning, who informed us earlier in May that the Mayor was considering an invitation from the Mayor of Moscow for 5 /6 December.

Could you please clarify whether the Mayor plans to come to Russia twice or whether you are now only considering a possibility of building the visit around the Sochi Games Opening Ceremony. The time around the games will be very busy for us, as we are likely to have a number of other UK VIP visitors to the Sochi Games in February and, in view of the very limited resources available to us on the ground in Sochi, we would need to coordinate the Mayoral visit carefully with other planned VIP visits.

Alternatively the Mayor might want to time his visit to the British Business Embassy week we plan in Moscow, in January before the Winter Olympics start. Please find below the details of the BBE programme in Moscow:

Moscow: 20 – 28 January 2014

The British Business Embassy Moscow will take place in HMA's Residence. It will comprise of a number of events over 5 - 7 days. Using the Olympic Legacy theme, and showcasing our contribution to Sochi 2014, the BBE will highlight the best of British business, design and technology across all sectors covered by UKTI Russia.

The centre piece of the BBE, under the Sport is GREAT banner, will be events on the first two days to highlight the UK's contribution to the success of Sochi 2014. Some of the 50 British businesses that worked on Sochi 2014 will host panel discussions, workshops and networking receptions to showcase their contribution to Sochi 2014, exchange views and ideas, discuss challenges and develop strong global partnerships.

After the Sport is GREAT events, the BBE will host GREAT-branded seminars and networking receptions across all sectors covered by UKTI Russia.

Hosting the BBE in Moscow would allow us to reach a large, high quality business and political audience and ensure widespread press coverage. The UK's contribution to Sochi will be "front of mind" with business partners during the two weeks of the Games and we estimate that the BBE will generate at least 100 significant assists for each UKTI Russia team.

Finally, holding the BBE before Sochi will ensure it does not get "lost in the noise" of the Winter Olympics, and the branding of BBE events will not fall under the strict advertising restrictions imposed in Sochi. In addition, access for business partners and visitors will not be restricted.

Skolkovo Innovation Centre

Skolkovo was launched in 2010 by Dmitry Medvedev, the then Russian president, as the flagship of his campaign to modernise the economy. The idea is to bring start-ups, leading science and technology companies, research and education together at a new techno-park that will act as a catalyst for innovation across Russia. The complex is headed by Russian oligarch Viktor Vekselberg and co-chaired by former Intel CEO Craig Barrett.

Taking in account the high number of fast growing tech companies, backed financially and having desire to grow international, a visit to Skolkovo could be useful (subject to time permitting as it involves traveling outside of Moscow) in order to link the Tech City in London and promote opportunities for the Tech companies.

Russia has invested Rbs50bn (\$1.6bn) in Skolkovo so far, mostly to finance construction at a 1,000 acre site on the western flank of Moscow, where the technopark is being built from scratch. Many of the world's leading technology companies, including Cisco, Siemens, Intel and Microsoft have been drawn by the promise of tax breaks. Some will establish research and development centres to sit alongside SkolTech, a university campus being developed in partnership with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Russia is famous for scientific talent, but not for entrepreneurial thinking that can turn bright ideas into profitable businesses. Skolkovo has set out to change that, providing space and finance for inventors, and links with venture capitalist firms. More than Rbs9.47bn worth of grants has already been distributed among 209 start-ups.

Russian investors in London (Financial Services)

Currently there are several Russian banks operating in London. This includes:

- VTB Bank is one of the leading universal banks of Russia. VTB Bank and its subsidiaries form a leading Russian financial group VTB Group, offering a wide range of banking services and products in Russia, CIS, Europe, Asia, Africa, and the U.S. The Group's largest subsidiaries in Russia are VTB24, Bank of Moscow, and TransCreditBank. VTB was ranked 236th on the FT Global 500 2011.
- Alpha Bank. Founded in 1990, Alfa Banking Group offers a wide range of products and operates in all sectors of the financial market, including corporate and retail lending, deposits, payment and account services, foreign exchange operations, cash handling services, custody services, investment banking and other ancillary services to corporate and retail customers. Alfa Banking Group is headquartered in Moscow, with branch network consisting of 511 offices across Russia and abroad, includes a subsidiary bank in the Netherlands and financial subsidiaries in the United States, the United Kingdom and Cyprus, and employs approximately 21,000 people. Alfa Banking Group is ultimately owned by 6 shareholders through ABH Holdings S.A.
- **-Vnesheconombank**. The legal status and activity of State Corporation 'Bank for Development and Foreign Economic Affairs (Vnesheconombank)'s is governed by the Federal Law "On the Bank for Development" (№82 FZ, adopted on May 17, 2007). Vnesheconombank operates to diversify the Russian economy, boost its competitive edge

and encourage investment activity. The Bank for Development is responsible for providing investment, foreign economic, insurance and consultative support for projects in Russia and abroad aimed at developing infrastructure, innovations, special economic zones, environment protection, providing support for exports of Russian products, works and services as well as supporting small and medium-sized enterprises.

- **Gazprombank**. Gazprombank has successfully operated in banking sicne 1990. Founded by Gazprom, the world's largest gas producer and exporter, to provide banking services for the gas industry enterprises. Gazprombank has since become a leader in the banking industry, which key performance indicators place the Bank among the top three banks of Russia.

Moscow International Business Centre

Moscow International Business Center (Russian: Московский Международный Деловой Центр), also referred to as **Moscow-City**is a commercial district in central Moscow. Located near the Third Ring Road in Presnensky District of western Moscow, the Moscow-City area is currently under development.

The Moscow IBC is expected to become the first zone in Russia to combine business activity, living space and entertainment in one single development. The Moscow government first conceived the project in 1992. An estimated 250,000 – 300,000 people will be working, living, or visiting the complex at any given time.


In order to manage the project a public company CITY was created in 1992 which is responsible for overseeing the initial creation and development of Moscow City as well as its subsequent exploitation. CITY is also a general contractor and both landlord and lessor.

1) Russian investments

Russian FDI globally

Since 2003, fDi Markets has recorded 1,537 FDI projects from Russia – with the Coal, Oil and Natural Gas accounting for almost one-fifth (18%) of projects. Project volume in this sector peaked during 2010, with 34 projects tracked. Total jobs creation and capital investment in this sector was 43,084 jobs and GBP 35.38 billion respectively.

Leading Destinations

Out of a total of 109 destination countries, the top five account for 28.4% of projects. Ukraine is the top destination country accounting for one-tenth of projects tracked, followed by Germany. The UK has performed comparatively poorly in comparison – being only the 9th largest destination market with 44 projects recorded. Of these 31 projects went into London.

Russian FDI into Germany

Since 2003, fDi Markets reports that there have been 80 Russian FDi projects going into Germany. Out of a total of 25 sectors, transportation has accounted for almost one-sixth (15%) of projects. Out of a total of 29 destination cities, the top five account for more than two-fifths of projects. Munich is the top destination city accounting for more than one-tenth of projects tracked.

According to data from BvD there are 60 Russian owned companies located in London, the majority of which are operating in the Financial Services or Natural Resources sector.

Russian Companies on London Stock Exchange

London remains a popular location for Russian companies to raise capital. There are a total of 30 Russian Incorporated companies listed on the London Stock Exchange, with a combined market capitalisation of £308m.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, the majority of these are in oil & gas and natural resources sectors – including the likes of Gazprom. Banks including Sberbank & VTB Bank also have London listings.

In October, Tinkoff Credit Systems, a fast-growing Russian credit card issuer, raised \$1.1bn in a London IPO that was heavily oversubscribed.

Alexander Mamut (age 53 worth \$2.3 billion) made his fortune as an investor, mostly within the media industry and telecom sector, with a 50% stake in Evroset, a mobile phone chain he recently sold to Alisher Usmanov for \$1 billion. Ouside Russia he is known for his investment in the Social Network "LiveJournal".


Mamut bought in 2011 the British bookshop, Waterstones, appointing James Daunt as Managing Director.

Alexander Lebedev (age 53, worth \$1.1 billion) is the owner of the Russian Newspaper "Novaya Gazeta" Russia's leading opposition newspaper. His investments in London are in the Newspaper sector, as he is the owner of London's Evening Standard and the UK's The Independent. His son, Evgeny, grew up in London and has several business and charitable interests, including Japanese restaurant Sake no Hana, and an office on Hill Street.

Roman Abramovich (age 47, worth \$10.2 billion) made his fortune with the Investment Company Millhouse Capital, managing stakes for major Russian companies such as Aeroflot, oil and electricity Companies. In the UK he owns the Chelsea soccer team.

Alisher Usmanov (age 60, worth \$17.8 billion) is the richest man in Russia, and his investments go from steel to telecom, with stakes in Megaphone, Facebook, Twitter and Spotify. In the UK he controls 30% of Arsenal Football Club.

High-end real estate is a popular investment class for Russian investors – with residential properties in Knightsbridge, Kensington, Chelsea and Notting Hill all being popular. Maddox Street, just off Regent Street, is populated with Russian-owned boutiques.

3rd Moscow Urban Forum 2013

The Moscow Urban Forum has established itself as an international event for discussions between some of world's most acknowledged experts in city planning and urban development. Discussions focus on the opportunities and challenges that are vital for modern megacities not only in the context of economy and efficient management, but through the eyes of individual citizens.

This year's theme is "Megacities: Success Beyond the Centre". The overwhelming majority of the Moscow population lives outside the city centre, so the development of the suburbs is crucial in improving the lives of most people in the city.

Day 1 will look at the experience of world cities; Day 2 at challenges facing Moscow.

Speaking points

- We are planning for the largest population growth the city has seen in over 100 years. To do that, we need to manage the development, regeneration and local economy of a large area outside the central core of the city
- The Mayor has published a specific outer London development strategy to ensure that the high streets, community centres and local areas across London's boroughs, played a key role in London's economic success.
- To meet the challenges we face as a city, we have to realise the housing potential of outer London's town centres and improving the offer of outer London's trading estates
- And what do you need to do this?
 - First and foremost you need investment in transport infrastructure to unlock the development potential of brownfield sites outside the centre;
 - Second, you need to be openly banging the drum for investment and create conditions that encourage the private sector to invest;
 - o and third, we've worked closely and cooperate with locally-elected councils to drive this regeneration.

Background

Similarities:

- London and Moscow are both the economic and political centres of each country, both accounting for a large chunk of GDP and economic growth, roughly similar size (Moscow is 1-2m more people).
- Key thing is that both have growing populations and are therefore challenged with providing more housing, more transport capacity and encourage growth in key sectors in order to provide more jobs.
- Both have transport systems that move millions of people every day.

Differences:

- London is the world's leading financial centre, which is something Moscow wants to emulate with its Moscow International Finance Centre. This is an area in which Moscow and London collaborates - TheCityUK provides advice and assistance.
- Car usage in Moscow is such that the city regularly experiences severe traffic jams and, although car use in London is still high, London doesn't experience jams on the same scale

'Big Moscow' reform:

- The background to this is that the Moscow city limits have been extended, almost doubling the size of the city.
- This gives the Mayor power over a much extended area and, its proponents argue, will provide space for new residential and employment areas. Much of the area is currently green space so
- the key challenge for then is how to build new urban areas spaces whilst preserving some of this green space and integrating them into the original urban fabric of the city.

It is through the London Plan that the GLA sets out a co-ordinated blueprint for growth in the capital. Key aspects of our plans are:

- **33 Opportunity Areas and 10 Intensification Areas**, together providing capacity for at least 250,000 homes and 500,000 jobs.
- Growth Areas (including parts of the Thames Gateway and London-Stansted-Cambridge-Peterborough).
- The Central Activities Zone, home to London's largest concentration of financial and business services and almost a third of all London jobs.
- Two Enterprise Zones at the Royal Docks and Battersea.
- Over 200 Town Centres, the focus for projected growth in retail floorspace.
- Strategic Outer London Development Centres, each with distinct economic strengths of greater than sub-regional importance, such as Croydon (where 7,500 jobs and 10,000 new homes will be created).

Well serviced offices fit for the global economy are diminished in their usefulness without world class transport infrastructure. This is why from the Airport to Crossrail II and Thameslink, to new tube line extensions such as Vauxhall Nine Elms, we are determined to keep the pipeline of significant transport infrastructure projects flowing. And also why the the Mayor has recently devoted a £300m fund from TfL's overall budget to assist schemes that are necessary for housing and business growth.



1. Background

You are participating in two panel discussions as part of Day One of the 3rd Moscow Urban Forum. The First Plenary will take place on Thursday morning with a focus on "Success beyond the centre," and the Second Plenary will take place on Thursday afternoon with a focus on "Establishment of centres of attraction in areas beyond the centre." During each of these Plenaries, each participant will be asked to give a 10 minute speech and then take part in a 30 minute panel discussion.

The Moscow Urban Forum has established itself as an important international event for discussions between some of world's most acknowledged experts in city planning and urban development. Discussed are the opportunities and challenges that are vital for modern megacities and the growth perspectives of global cities not only in the context of economy and efficient management, but through the eyes of an individual citizen as well.

The Moscow Urban Forum provides a centre point for annual meetings and productive discussions as well as exchange of experience between specialists who care about the future of global cities. This is an international event for experts, investors and potential partners interested in the development of the Russian capital and the implementation of projects in cooperation with the Moscow City Government.

The development path that Moscow has followed over the last several years is unique. Russia's largest megacity is acting as a platform where a range of current ideas on urban planning are being tested and then implemented in other regions of the country. The Moscow Urban Forum is a place for an exchange of positive experience where the heads of Russia's largest cities – from Kaliningrad to Vladivostok – have an opportunity to communicate with the heads of global capitals and discuss current issues with recognized international experts.

2. 3rd Moscow Urban Forum, 2013 - Narrative

Megacities: success beyond the centre

If the watchword of the city 2000s was exclusivity, in the 2010s it has become sociality. Urban planning is once again concerned with the majority, with the ordinary citizen's quality of life, work and leisure. The periphery is now the centre of attention. The periphery is where 90% of the population live, and it is where the fate of the megapolis is being decided.

From Greater London to Greater Paris, New Rome to the New York agglomeration, the entire civilised world is trying to solve problems of the periphery. Large cities are experiencing significant growth, with the majority of their populations living away from the city centre, in districts that vary both in the character of their buildings and local governance. More and more, planning, transport and housing policies are being integrated together, taking into account regional development needs, thus making balanced, high-growth development possible. This is what we see in Shanghai, Istanbul, Singapore, Seul, Tokyo and other major cities.

The growth of the megapolis brings with it its own complications, which show up most acutely at the cities edge — in the first instance, problems of social disintegration and crime.

The suburban 'uprisings' in Berlin, Paris and London in the 2000s demonstrated to us that the civilised world has yet to find a solution to these problems. If it is a challenge for cities in rich and powerful nations, it is even more of a problem for the megacities of developing countries, such as Mexico City, Cairo or Seoul (each with populations over 20 million people). The 'Challenge of the Slums' was the title given to a 2003 UN report, recognising that every sixth person on Planet Earth now lives in slums.

Developing the city's periphery can unlock huge potential, but it won't be done by itself. Cities need to be looking for their own answers to many questions of used to help development at the periphery? How can problematic districts be regenerated? How can we create and improve an attractive visual identity at the periphery? How can we ensure local government is working for these areas, as well as including the community in solving the problems? All of these questions are to one extent or another relevant to Moscow today.

Moscow is a rich city. The Soviet legacy left the city with technically well-developed districts and comparatively high social standards. There are no slums in Moscow. But problems of the city's periphery are critical here too.

Moscow has a tiny historical centre. The city is now ten times the size of what it was at the start of the twentieth century. And yet people still think of the city only in terms of its old historical centre. Moscow means the Kremlin, Red Square, the boulevards, Gorky Park and the Stalin skyscrapers; Moscow does not mean Bibiryevo, Biryulyevo, Zhulyebino or Zyuzino. It is quite normal to ignore 85% of the city's territory, writing it off as a grey zone, deprived of all identity.

Moscow has a very compact centre, a centre that actually combines five centres — political, cultural, finance, trade and business. Each of the centres support each other, but they do not have a lot of room to co-exist.

Moscow has a very busy centre: some 80% of the city's workspaces are located in just 7% of its territory. The hyper-development of the city centre has brought with it traffic, ecological and logistical problems. It has also seen property values skyrocket. Practically the entire city centre

is closed for development: any significant demolition or building creates an upheaval felt across the entire country.

The periphery has thus become the main resource for our development. But it is also our main problem. We have two types of periphery — industrial zones and residential suburbs. Industrial zones need to be converted; residential suburbs need to be reconstructed. We already have amassed some experience in developing the periphery. The scale of the programme to redevelop 5-storey Krushchev-era housing blocks is without analogue in the world; and we have built academic (Moscow State University, the Academy of Sciences), business (Moscow City) and trade (Crocus City) centres on the periphery of the city. We have begun work on large-scale new projects on the periphery (the ZIL cultural centre and Skolkovo centre for innovation). But we have yet to create districts on the periphery that are of comparable value to the centre; while the dimensions of Moscow's periphery mean that any development is bound to fade into insignificance compared to the work that remains to be done.

How can we go about creating or increasing the value of the periphery? How can we create new urban centres? Which development approach is most sensitive to contemporary realities? How can we create a new quality of urban environment? How do we reconcile the interests of residents and the priorities of development? Where do we move to in order to develop — to New Moscow, to the old residential suburbs, to industrial zones? How do we resolve transport problems? How can we disperse workplaces?

Politically, Moscow's periphery represents 7 million voters. Economically, it represents 200 million square metres and 1 trillion dollars in property value. We need a programme to develop this periphery. Essentially, what this means is that we need to create a national plan for middle class, post-Soviet housing. We need to move away from faceless standardisation; we need to create necessary infrastructure and services; and we need business to be motivated to build such housing. Solving this problem this problem will open up new horizons for the periphery in cities across Russia and the world.

Sergey Sobyanin, Mayor of Moscow



Sergey Semyonovich Sobyanin (born 21 June 1958) has been Mayor of Moscow since October 21, 2010. Former Russian vice-premier and ex-head of the President's Administration, Sobyanin took over from Yury Luzhkov who had been in charge of the city for 18 years and was fired in 2010 by then-President Medvedev. He served as Mayor of Moscow from October 2010 to 5 July 2013, and was re-elected Mayor in the September 2013 city election.

Igor Shuvalov, First Deputy Chairman of the Government of Russia



Igor Ivanovich Shuvalov (born 4 January 1967) is a Russian lawyer and politician. He currently serves as First Deputy Prime Minister in Dmitry Medvedev's Cabinet, after being re-appointed to the post on 21 May 2012. Previously, he served in the same capacity in Vladimir Putin's Second Cabinet. As First Deputy Prime Minister, he is the most senior member of the cabinet besides the Prime Minister and is responsible for federal budget and economic policies.

Fernando de Mello Franco, Sao Paolo Secretary for Urban Development



Fernando de Mello Franco is an architect and holds a PhD from the Architecture and Urbanism College of University of São Paulo. Previously, he has been a managing partner of MMBB Architects and curator of URBEM - Institute of Urbanism and Studies for the Metropolis. He taught architecture and urbanism at the School of Engineering of USP São Carlos, Mackenzie and USJT and was visiting professor at Harvard. He has extensive experience in architecture and urban projects, with focus on urban infrastructure, housing, and slum redevelopment.

Yuri Grigoryan, Director of Project Meganom, Architectural Bureau



For the past 14 years the bureau has successfully implemented more than twenty projects. During this time, the range and scale of the solutions have grown – from private houses to urban planning concepts. - Venues such as the Press and Broadcast Centres have been developed so they can be adapted for commercial use after Games.
- Legacy careers programme in place with construction job brokerage service up and running. Announcements on apprenticeships and job milestones – Spring 2013

New neighbourhoods

- Five new neighbourhoods will be developed over 20 years, with 3 schools, 9 nurseries, 3 health centres and 29 playgrounds.
- Up to 8,000 new homes will be built in addition to the 2,800 homes in the athletes' village.

iCity

The Press Centre and Broadcast Centre will become a new commercial and employment site after the Games.

- iCITY proposes the creation of more than 4,000 jobs directly on site with training and apprenticeship opportunities. Claims a further 2,000 jobs could be generated in the local area through iCITY supply chain and consumer spending effects.
- The iCITY vision is to create a world-class centre of innovation and enterprise with some of the most advanced digital infrastructure in Europe
- This vision is to build upon the existing success of east London's flourishing digital and creative industries, and help to stimulate long-term economic growth in the UK.
- The iCITY vision is to bring together start-up businesses, SMEs, established global companies, investors, and social enterprises, in one space, to promote collaboration and innovation.
- The iCITY vision is to host a data centre, media studios, a university, a digital academy and a new business incubator to develop a technology cluster of international significance.

Cultural hub for South East

- Livenation appointed to deliver summer 2013 concert programme. North Park and Copper Box opening from July 2013; Summer 2013 details tbc (Jan 2013), including sporting, community and concerts
- Ride London August 2013, World Federation Badminton Grand Prix October 2013, Bids to be awarded for Gay Games 2018, World Diving 2014
- Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park brand to be launched spring 2013
- There will be over 22 miles of interlinking pathways, waterways and cycle paths.
- The park will have 252 acres (102 hectares) of open space.

Team London

Team London has created a strategy and workplan to deliver the legacy (see attached powerpoint presentation). The key strands of the work are:

- To deliver a Team London Ambassador Visitor Welcome, similar to GamesTime, at 6 prime tourist locations across 6 summer weeks
- To deliver Team London volunteers to support key cultural and sporting events in the capital. A schedule of events has been planned for the year the first two events to be recruited for this year is the UEFA Champions League Final and the Saracen's rugby club home games.
- Each event organiser has agreed to offer 10% of their opportunities to young unemployed people to help them gain life skills and experience.

- To deliver a Team London Ambassador in every London school. A pilot in 6 schools has started this term to test the objectives and delivery of three main objectives:
- To inspire young people to volunteer.
- To inspire young people to learn about the city they live in.
- To help create a vegetable garden in every school, through signposting to Rosie Boycott's programme, and helping to engage the local community to provide support and expertise.
- To deliver a digital volunteering platform, which will make it easier for volunteers to find any opportunities and which will highlight key Mayoral priorities. Highlighted priorities will be:
- Initiatives to improve quality of life. For example environmental projects such as Capital Clean Up, RE:LEAF and Pocket Parks..
- Skills and Employment initiatives, to help young people gain skills, improve literacy and gain employment. For example YouLondon, Love Latin.
- To work to engage CSR departments to pool together all the volunteer work they do individually on skills and employment to make a real impact on youth skills and employment.
- To create a "Team London rewards" system to recognise and reward Team London volunteers.

Boris Johnson language:

the greatest Olympic and Paralympic Games that have ever been held. I think anthropologists will look back with awe at the change that took place in our national mood - the sudden switcheroo from the gloom of the previous weeks.

You remember what they were saying? When the buses were on strike and the taxi drivers were blockading

without delay. And the volunteers revealed a kindness and a friendliness that we had almost forgotten. And

the tube trains ran with metronomic efficiency. The Jubilee line going three miles an hour faster than they did when I was elected.

And the sociologists will write learned papers on that sudden feeling that gripped us all.

Was it eudaimonia, euphoria, eupepsia or some other Greek word beginning with eu? You name it

Was it relief? It was surprise, wasn't it? There we were, little old us, the country that made such a Horlicks of the Millennium Dome. Putting on a flawless performance of the most logistically difficult thing you can ask a

country to do in peacetime. And some of us were frankly flabbergasted, gobsmacked.

And I want you to hold that thought, remember that feeling of surprise - because, that surprise is revealing of

our chronic tendency in this country to underestimate what we can do.

And we need now to learn the lessons of the Olympics and Paralympics. The moment when we collectively rediscovered that we are a can-do country. A creative, confident, can-do country.

The Olympics succeeded because we planned for years and we worked together. Public sector and private sector.

And we created the conditions in training and infrastructure that allowed our young people to take on the best

of the rest of the world and do better than them. We gave them the stages to perform on. The stadia in which

they could show their competitive genius. And that is exactly what we have to do with the economy today.

And as I look ahead I am filled with confidence about the capital

Through the age of austerity to a new age

of Enterprise in which we do what we did in the Olympics and build a world-beating platform for Britain for

British people and businesses to compete and win and we need to do it now under the Conservatives and we

will and it begins here.

So I want to ask the smile question: what was the greatest thing about the Games of London 2012?

It all went well, didn't it, but I'll tell you the thing that gives me the most confidence for the future. It wasn't that the transport system performed well, or the fact that the G4S guards all turned up, or even the performance of Team GB. It was the preparation, the absolute determination to get a legacy from the Games. I could take you [back] to the Olympic city where the buddleia is poking through the cracks in the venues and

tumbleweed is blowing down the Olympic Village – and look at what we already have on that Stratford site today – £1.5m Westfield with 48m visits; Stratford hub; largest park; 8000 homes. We have the prospect of high-tech jobs in the International Broadcasting Centre (IBC) and Main Press Centre (MPC) and we will have a glorious future for that Stadium with or without American football.

And the spills over benefits are being seen across east London. We now have a huge competition to develop Silvertown Quays. We have the Siemens Crystal. The cable car. We are going to see a transformation of that area on a scale not seen since George lacobescu and his colleagues had the brilliant idea of developing Canary Wharf. And this transformation is essential to cope with London's growing population – [we will reach] 9 million before New York.

The Department for Foreign Economic Activity and International Relations is the executive bosy of the City of Moscow responsible for drafting and implementing municipal policy on attracting foreign investment, developing international and foreign economic ties, maintaining Moscow's international credit rating and individual debt obligations, sovereign foreign loans, holding international conferences and exhibitions, promoting Moscow as an international financial centre and supporting Russians abroad.

Suggested lines to take

Future cooperation and Partnership Agreement

London has moved away from signing formal MOUs and is not renewing its Partnership Agreements with other cities. Instead, we now prefer to collaborate on an ad-hoc issue-by-issue basis. Moscow and London are already cooperating in a wide range of areas, including transport management via Deputy Mayor Isabel Dedring and resilience and disaster management through the London Resilience Partnership. While London is not renewing its partnership agreements with other cities, we are happy to continue providing Moscow with information, advice and support.

Days of Moscow 2014

The Minister is likely to ask that we agree to host this event in London next year – either in City Hall or in another location. Recommend that we refer the Minister to the British Council which is coordinating the UK-Russia Year of Culture on the UK side, or offer to refer this to them on his behalf.

Visit to Russia by the Mayor of London

Although this is not on the agenda of the meeting, it's possible they will raise the prospect of the Mayor's visit. We have previously said that the Mayor will visit either during the Sochi Winter Games or later in the year.
