This may include such things as talking points prior to meetings; the minutes of meetings themselves or other types of follow up briefings or memos. It may also include what the ICO calls 'raw notes' or 'aide-memoire notes'. These are handwritten notes made at meetings and I only request them in the event that there are no formal minutes of the meetings.

I can confirm the GLA holds some of the information you have requested. We conducted searches with the Mayor's office, Sir Edward Lister, Richard Blakeway and David Lunts and we can release to you all of the information identified as being in-scope of your request. This information is attached.
