Dear Joanna

Thank you so much for your kind words. I am of course thrilled to be re-elected, and am acutely conscious that I could not have achieved anything without the help and support of thousands of people across London.

We have a new mandate: to drive jobs and growth, to modernise our transport networks, and to deliver the 9 point plan on which I was elected, and my team and I are going to work our socks off to get it done.

As you may already be aware, I pledged in my manifesto to look at the feasibility of a pedestrian and cycle bridge to connect the emerging new city quarter at Nine Elms with the established areas of Pimlico and Chelsea. This idea has the broad support of the local authorities on the southern side of the river and has also been discussed with the London Borough of Westminster. Transport for London (TfL) has been looking at the idea of a bridge, with input from the engineering consultancy Buro Happold and David Marks from Marks Barfield Architects, and I believe that there is merit for a bridge in this location. The initial estimated cost for the bridge is circa £20m.

During the coming months TfL will be moving forward with the feasibility work and engaging with all interested parties, including the residents and politicians on the Northern bank of the river. We will then need to find a suitable champion for the project to help raise the necessary funds to complete it.

Whilst I would very much like to hear both yours and Thomas's ideas for a new bridge across the Thames personally unfortunately, preparations for the Olympic and Paralympic Games are placing many additional restrictions on my availability throughout the summer, making it impossible for me to do so. However, I would like you to meet my Chief of Staff, Sir Edward Lister, and my Deputy Mayor for Transport, Isabel Dedring, on my behalf. If this is acceptable please contact Sir


