To whom it may concern:

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC).

I would like to know how much money has been spent, and how much remains, in MOPAC's Online Hate Crime Hub fund <u>between 27 July 2016</u> (when the Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime's approved its funding) to the present day, or the last day where data is held.

I would also like to know how much money remains in the fund as of the present day, or the last day where data is held.

Please break down by category all the uses to which the money has been put between 27 July 2016 and the present day, or the last day where data is held.

Please provide the information in the form of a Microsoft Excel or .csv file.

If it is not possible to provide the information requested due to the information exceeding the cost of compliance limits identified in Section 12, please provide advice and assistance, under your Section 16 obligations, as to how I can refine my request to be included in the scope of the Act.

In any case, if you can identify ways that my request could be refined please provide further advice and assistance to indicate this.

I look forward to your response within 20 working days, as stipulated by the Act.

RESPONSE

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of & November to the Mayor's Office for Policing And Crime (MOPAC). I confirm that your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and that MOPAC does hold information relating to your request, as follows:

In January 2016, MOPAC successfully applied to the Home Office Police Innovation Fund (PIF) for funding to develop a proof of concept project to deliver an online hate crime hub. The total programme cost is £1,730,726 of which £452,756 has been awarded in PIF monies. The remaining costs are match funded in cross-partner resources from MOPAC and the MPS; the largest contribution being the provision of dedicated police officer resources.

To the end of Quarter two 2016, £78,054 is the total monies spent on the project, of which £19,904 is granted money from the PIF. This has been spent on:

- Programme Management
- Police Officer Time
- Office Costs
- Evaluation

£1,652,672 remains in the budget for this project which is funded for two years to the end of March 2018.
