Decision required – supporting report

1. Introduction and background

- 1.1. An independent audit of the IBM Websphere licences (by Deloitte in 2016) highlighted there were a number of under-subscribed licences.
- 1.2. The MPS has been in discussions with IBM to resolve the under-subscription of Websphere licences. An agreement has been reached, which will require the MPS to make a one-off payment of £789,000 to IBM. The cost will cover the already consumed Websphere licences and allow the MPS to be compliant with the terms and conditions of the licences.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Metropolitan Police Service is seeking approval to resolve the undersubscription of IBM Websphere Licences.

A. RECOMMENDATIONS - That the Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime

 Approves a one-off revenue payment to IBM of £789k to settle the undersubscription of IBM Websphere licences and to note that the payment is fully covered in the Digital Policing (DP) 2017/18 budget.

B. SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 1. An independent audit of the IBM Websphere licences (by Deloitte in 2016) has determined the number of under-subscribed licences.
- 2. The MPS has already consumed the Websphere licences, and therefore MPS has continued to use IBM's software whilst currently being out of compliance with its licence terms and conditions.
- 3. Procurement route will be direct with IBM which is the only route available.

C. OTHER ORGANISATIONAL & COMMUNITY IMPLICATIONS

 Software licensing of the Websphere software is only available from IBM, which owns all the rights to the product. No other supplier is available. There is a high risk that the supplier will pursue a legal challenge to recover the costs of under-subscription if the settlement is not approved.
