Thank you for your request for information which the Greater London Authority (GLA) received on 29 June 2020. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You requested:

- 1) Are the non-statutory deputy mayors of London classified as employees of the GLA?*
- 2) Are the non-statutory deputy mayors of London eligible to join the Local Government Pension Scheme?*
- 3) Which GLA pay grade, if any, do the non-statutory deputy mayors of London fall under?*
- 4) What pay grade is the Mayor of London's private secretary? And is the post politically restricted?*

Please find below our response to your request:

- 1) Yes, with the exception of the Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime who is an employee of the Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC).
- 2) Yes, where they are employees of the GLA.
- 3) The current pay of all non-statutory Deputy Mayors is available here: <https://www.london.gov.uk/people/mayoral>. In common with other senior roles at the GLA, their salaries are set outside the grading system.
- 4) There is no post within the GLA that has the job title stated. We do have the following posts:
 - Head of Mayor's Private Office- grade 13, politically restricted
 - Deputy Head of Mayor's Private Office- grade 9, politically restricted
