Thank you for your request for information which the Greater London Authority (GLA) received on 6 November 2017 about commercial premises that are currently vacant, with a rateable value of £10,000 or more where the account holder is liable for empty property rates. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You asked for;

- *The full address including postcode*
- *Property reference number*
- *The name of the account holder where it is not an individual (if it is, please leave it blank)*
- *The rateable value of the property*
- *The date on which the premises first became vacant*
- *The type of property*

Your request appears to be aimed at local Borough Councils. The GLA does hold a small amount of information relating to your request because in April 2012, the Greater London Authority inherited 635 hectares of land. The Mayor pledged to release all the surplus land for development to encourage investment, create jobs and help meet London's housing needs.
