Thank you for your request for information which the GLA received on 30 July 2019. Your request has been dealt with under the Freedom of Information Act (FOI) 2000.

Our response to your request is as follows:

1. I am writing, in accordance with Freedom of Information legislation, to request the release of correspondence and information on meetings with food/beverage/retail industry representatives regarding the ban of unhealthy food advertising on the TfL estate.

Moreover, I request any correspondence between McDonald's, KFC, Just Eat, or Deliveroo and the following people within GLA: Paul Lindley, Matt Creamer, Rosalind Louth, Ciara Litchfield, Jamie Izzard, and Vicky Hobart. The time span for which I would like to request such correspondence is April 2018 to January 2019

Please find attached. Please note that some information is exempt from disclosure under s.40 (Personal information) of the Freedom of Information Act. This information includes names and biographical information which would identify specific employees and as such constitutes as personal data which is defined by Article 4(1) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) to mean any information relating to an identified or identifiable living individual. It is considered that disclosure of this information would contravene the first data protection principle under Article 5(1) of GDPR which states that Personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner in relation to the data subject.

Some information which falls within scope of part 3 of your request has been withheld from disclosure under section 43 (1) Trade secrets and (2) Commercial interests of the FOIA. This provides that information can be withheld from release if its disclosure would, or would be likely to, prejudice the commercial interests of any person.

A commercial interest relates to a person's ability to participate competitively in a commercial activity and in this instance, some of the information contained within the email exchanges reveal information relating to their business strategy, including products, pricing, services, and marketing. This information would confer a competitive advantage on any competitor the named food industry organisations.

We consider that, in addition, some of the information exchanged between the GLA and the food industry is exempt from disclosure under Section 41 (Information provided in confidence). The exchanges are clearly not trivial in nature and are not publicly accessible. It is explicitly stated within some of the exchanges that the information is commercially sensitive and confidential and should not be released.

Section 43(2) constitutes a qualified exemption from our duty to disclose information under the FOIA and consideration must be given as to whether the public interest favouring disclosure of the information covered by this exemption outweighs the public interest considerations favouring maintaining the exemption and withholding the information. In this instance we consider it not to be in the public interest to release information that would be likely to be detrimental to commercial activities, for example, if obtained by competitors.



As you may already have heard, today the Mayor has announced the publication of the draft London Food Strategy for consultation. The consultation period will last for eight weeks and will end on 5th July. The draft strategy can be found at

London has one of the highest childhood overweight and obesity rates in Europe, with almost 40 per cent of children aged 10 and 11 overweight or obese. Children from poorer areas of the capital are disproportionately affected – which Sadiq believes is a scandal in a city as prosperous at London. We're calling on the Government to treat the issue as a priority by joining him in the fight against child obesity.

We are consulting in this strategy on proposals to ban advertisements for unhealthy food and drink across the TfL network, including the London Underground, London Overground and the capital's buses and bus shelters, as part of a package of measures to take on child obesity.

This means that advertisements for food and drink defined as unhealthy by the Government's Nutrient Profiling Model would not be carried, as well as advertisements for food and drink companies that simply advertise the company's brand or restaurant name or

directs people to the nearest restaurant. It is important to note that advertising for healthy food products would still be permitted.

It's important that the voices of Londoners and London businesses are heard during the consultation period. 






It was the result of human error at one of our media agencies, which the ASA have accepted, and we made sure the advert was taken down as soon as we found out. We take care not to target our marketing at children – we never promote our kid's meals or advertise on kid's TV channels – so we're disappointed that this happened, and we've been working with the agency to put processes in place to make sure it doesn't happen again."

Further to our recent conversations, we have now had conversation from our appointed agency that they have completed their research into youth eating behaviour, having surveyed 1,126 children across London and 200 parents.

Essentially this research was looking to help us understand the role we play in food environments near schools, but ultimately also support a much broader discussion around where kids get their calories from, what they eat and why.

There are 4 broad component parts to this research:

- 1. People's perceptions of a healthy diet (kids vs parents)
- 2. Influence of parents on dietary choices amongst children
- 3. The impact of QSR and other retailer proximity to schools on food choices (i.e. environment impact)
- 4. The role of other food outlets, including local shops, coffee shops and Bakeries on children's' dietary behavior

1. Introduction

Child obesity is one of the biggest public health challenges of our time, and is on the rise. Globally, 70 million young children are predicted to be obese by 2025. England has one of the highest rates of child obesity in the world, and London's averages are even higher still. It's an issue of inequality; you are twice as likely to be obese growing up in one of the most deprived areas than in one of the most well-off areas. Over the last decade, lots of great work has been undertaken across the city to tackle the issue, and there is consensus that a 'whole-system approach' is needed to tackle such a complex issue. However, rising rates and increasing inequalities around this area show that further collective action is required.

The starting assumption is that child obesity is primarily not a problem of individual knowledge, motivation or self-discipline. Rather that child obesity is often 'a normal response to an abnormal environment'. The spaces in which many of London's children and young people spend their time have more barriers to healthy eating and activity than they do opportunities. This is especially true for those living in disadvantaged circumstances. The second premise is that the issue of child obesity is complex, but that taking action can be relatively simple. What is tipping the balance so that the health-promoting features of London's more deprived environments cumulate to outweigh those that are health-destroying.

2. London's Child Obesity Taskforce

London's Child Obesity Taskforce is a new independent multi-sector leadership group being convened by the Mayor of London. The vision for the group is to lead and galvanise system-wide activity across London that creates a step-change impact on child obesity rates in the city over the next decade. Its focus is on action – setting ambitious targets and driving work that makes every home, school, high street and green space an area that encourages a nutritious diet and everyday activity. This will build on existing evidence, reward those who lead the way, and hold others accountable to follow.

The new taskforce will be action-focused and led by a Chair, supported by a board membership of 12 and serviced by a fully operational secretariat. It will be advised biannually by an Expert Reference Group of academics and deep thinkers, underpinned by a Partnership Delivery Group: a multiagency programme management team compiled of the city's leading policy officers, tasked with programme managing and delivering the desired activity of the taskforce.

As a member of the new taskforce, you will be at the forefront of representing London's collective effort to affect the eating and activity environments for children and families in the city. You will be part of a group setting ambitious targets for the city; and identifying and co-ordinating the actions required to get there. This will include:

- Shaping the goal and direction for a London-wide strategic effort to tackle child obesity, specifically the inequality that exists within it, including the setting of annual targets for specific groups of stakeholders that work up towards a step change impact on overall rates.
- Collating and showcasing cutting edge activity already happening, and influencing this to be scaled up more widely.

The new taskforce will be expected to meet quarterly and at its inaugural meeting it will review, make any necessary amendments to, and agree, its strategic aims and planned activity. This and all other aspects of the taskforce will be reviewed on an annual basis by the Chair and board members, in line with a clear Terms of Reference, which will also to be agreed at its inaugural meeting.

The new taskforce will be directly accountable to the Mayor of London, and in turn the London Assembly. It will have a close relationship with other strategic bodies in London such as the London Health Board, the London Prevention Partnership Board and the London Food Board.

3. London's Child Obesity Taskforce - Board Member

Overview

4. London's Child Obesity Taskforce - Chair

Overview

Being appointed Chair of London's Child Obesity Taskforce will provide you with an opportunity to lead and direct London's Child Obesity Taskforce, on behalf of the Mayor of London. You will be personally accountable to the Mayor and be asked to represent the Mayor and the taskforce to a variety of audiences in London, nationally and internationally.

This is a role in which the issue of child obesity and health inequality must be extremely important to you. This is a highly competitive opportunity and the Mayor will only consider the appointment of a truly outstanding candidate who can be ambitious for the health of London's children, craft a vision that gets a grip of the inequality in child obesity, understand yet cut through the complexity of the obesogenic environment and manage the array of strategic partnerships and governance that this role demands.

This is your opportunity to lead a once-in-a-generation seismic shift in the world's greatest city - from being the world's leading global city for obese children to the world's leading global city on its reduction.

As Chair, you will be expected to oversee the taskforce and its board members, maintain positive relationships with them all, provide strategic direction and intervention, delegate tasks, provide guidance to policy officers, be experienced and comfortable with engaging the media and social media, lobby Government and business on behalf of London's children.

Candidate Requirements - Chair

Responsibilities

- Leading and chairing all London Child Obesity Taskforce meetings.
- Attending any sub-groups established by the board as assigned;

- Attending up to three half day workshops to contribute to the development of an action plan based on:
 - London's new Health Inequalities Strategy.
 - London's Health Care Devolution Memorandum of Understanding.
 - Current city-wide activity that the Taskforce agrees to build upon.
 - Other relevant ideas.
- Advising and supporting the Mayor on the delivery of his ambition to reduce child obesity, specifically the inequality that exists within it, supported by the Taskforce Secretariat and in accordance with London's Health Inequalities Strategy, and the GLA Health Team.
- Leading and representing the views of London's Child Obesity Taskforce in its work, meetings and events.
- Leading and representing the views of London's Child Obesity Taskforce at meetings with Mayoral advisors and key external partners.
- Ensuring that the diversity of London's communities and a whole system approach to reducing child obesity is reflected in the work of London's Child Obesity Taskforce.
- Acting as the key ambassador and spokesperson to the media and stakeholders relating to child obesity policy and GLA associated programmes.
- Act as a conduit between the taskforce and others working across the private, public and third sector who influence the choices and environments of children and their families.
- Overseeing the formulation of London's Child Obesity Taskforce work
 programme, working with the Taskforce Secretariat, the Partnership Delivery
 Group, the Expert Reference Group, the London Prevention Partnership Board
 and other relevant senior leaders and policy makers working to implement the
 aims and vision of the taskforce and reduce the impact of London's obesogenic
 environment on London's children.
- Ensuring the work of London's Child Obesity Taskforce, its members and governance of the board are working in accordance to the Terms of Reference.

- Ensuring London's Child Obesity Taskforce continues to have a balance of skills and diversity appropriate to directing the implementation of the delivery plan for the taskforce.
- Working with Chairs of other relevant Mayoral Boards and strategic city-wide groups to ensure integration between the delivery of the taskforce and other Mayoral strategies.
- Reporting to the Mayor/Mayoral advisor, meeting with them quarterly to update on work progress (or as needed).
- As required, represent the Mayor, the taskforce and London as an ambassador for child obesity in the city and the health inequalities that exist within it.

PERSON SPECIFICATION – Chair

In addition to the Member person specification, candidates considered for the Chair position will need to demonstrate:

- Ability to lead effectively to developing an action focused strategy aimed at reducing child obesity in London.
- Demonstrable track record, at a high level, of representing boards and/or organisations to influence policy.
- Ability to lead the taskforce in representing the Mayor effectively to external stakeholders with a high degree of professionalism.
- Ability to lead and broker connections between the taskforce and sectors that influence the eating and activity environments for children and families.
- Ability to lead in the delivery of policy related to London's Health Inequality
 Strategy as it relates to children and families.
- Excellent communication skills, with significant experience of communicating effectively, at a senior level, with opinion formers and senior sector representatives.
- Experience of interacting with the media and social media including an awareness of historic personal activity that is in the public domain which may support or contradict the activity of the taskforce and standards expected of the Chair of the taskforce.

Please ensure you demonstrate how you match the above criteria in your covering letter.

Diversity Statement

The aim is that the London Child Obesity Taskforce contains a broad range of experience and reflects the international nature of the capital. 5. Appointment Details

Term of the Appointment

The term of this appointment will be until May 2020 in line with the current Mayoral term.

Meetings

The Greater London Authority Health Team will provide the Secretariat for London's Child Obesity Taskforce, supported by Guy's and St Thomas Charity. The minutes of its quarterly meetings will be circulated in a timely fashion and will be made public on the Mayor of London's website.

Minimum time commitments

- Quarterly 2-hour plenary meetings or as business dictates
- 1-2 hours pre-meeting reading and preparation
- Up to 3 half day development workshops (e.g. delivery plan, strategic aims, observing expert panel)
- Attendance at launches, summits and special events
- Chairing working groups on key workstreams (up to two per year)

Remuneration/ Expenses

The position of member of London Child Obesity Taskforce is honorary and unremunerated although members will be entitled to be reimbursed, in accordance with the GLA's Expenses and Benefits Framework, for travel expenses reasonably incurred in performing their role in connection with the taskforce.

Board Members

Following the appointment of the Chair position, we expect interviews for board members of the London Child Obesity Taskforce to take place in early April 2018.

We anticipate the board member appointments to be made by the end of April 2018. The Mayor of London will confirm the appointments.



Hi Jamie - thanks again for the heads up and happy to be name checked especially as we've also said publicly we would continue advertising on the network. I include our response from before again for reference.

A couple of comments/caveats. First, we have a range of non-HFSS products because of the investment we have made (and continue to make) in our menu over many years – the latest example being our new Veggie Wrap and our first ever vegetarian Happy Meal launched just last week. That's certainly not the case with others in the industry.

I don't think it's entirely fair to say "across the TFL estate or national/global advertising". The approach we are taking in London is unique for two reasons: i) we're keen to work with the Mayor/you to address a specific concern and ii) as a result of the Mayor's priorities, policy in London has changed (or is changing).

Hope that makes sense and happy to chat if easier. And, if you can, any chance you might be able to share who else you might be looking to name check (just curious really)?

A McDonald's spokesperson:

"Health and wellbeing is an important issue and is one which industry has a responsible role to play.

"We believe that customers choose what and when they eat and we work hard to help them make informed choices. Today, nearly 90% of our menu is under 500 calories, nutritional information is clearly displayed and we have invested millions in technology which has enabled us to display information in a different way and show the breadth of our menu – such as salads, low or no sugar drinks and fruit bags. We will continue to invest to do the right thing.

"When it comes to advertising and marketing, we have always taken our responsibilities extremely seriously. We never advertise products considered to be high in fat, salt or sugar to children and are already in the process of changing our directional adverts in London which signpost nearby restaurants. Because of the choice we offer and the proactive changes we have made to our menu over many years, our customers in London will continue to see our adverts when travelling on the TfL network. "McDonald's has a long and proud history in the capital and we are committed to working in partnership with the Mayor to help ensure Londoners always have access to affordable, good food."

We would be keen for him to refer to the really positive approach McDonalds are taking on this policy, so I wanted to check whether you'd be happy for him to name check you along the following lines:

"We have already seen large advertisers like McDonalds and [TBC] confirm that they will continue to advertise on the network under the new rules."

And:

"We expect brands advertising HFSS products to switch to advertising healthier products in their range. And they are already making plans to do this – either specifically for TfL's estate, or for their national, and potentially global, campaigns. This includes big spenders like McDonalds and [TBC] who have a range of compliant products that they plan to continue advertising on the TfL estate".
