

London's new culture and education quarter

As you know, we have major new plans for Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park and Stratford to create a new culture and education quarter in East London.

This new 'Olympicopolis' (so dubbed in reference to the ambition and achievement of the great museums in South Kensington created as 'Albertopolis' after the 1851 Great Exhibition) will bring new jobs, new homes and a new cultural complex to London. The new Quarter is expected to generate some £5 billion Gross Value Added for the area by 2030 and to deepen even further London's reputation as a city of culture for Londoners and international visitors.

This cultural and education complex will bring together a range of artistic partners within one area. Cultural partners will include the Victoria and Albert Museum, the University of the Arts London, Sadler's Wells, and potential international partners such as the Smithsonian Institution. University College London is also advancing plans to bring a new campus to the Park.

The London Legacy Development Corporation is overseeing the new site's transformation into the cultural quarter. We expect to create commercial and development opportunities to fund the main development of the site. In addition the plans enjoy strong support from central Government and were included in the UK National Infrastructure Plan by the Chancellor of the Exchequer last autumn.

But, to achieve the cultural quarter and the realisation of new spaces for these prestigious institutions we will need to generate philanthropy through a multi-million pound fundraising campaign.

We are working with a number of specialist agencies and advisers to advance Olympicopolis and have asked [REDACTED] to seek the advice of a small number of cultural leaders and supporters to help us scope the potential for a philanthropic campaign on this scale.

We want to understand more about how our vision for the Cultural Quarter is perceived by those who know London's cultural environment well and we would welcome your advice in formulating our approach.

We have asked [REDACTED] to speak to you and to a number of other leading people in order to explore this topic and to seek your advice and input to our plans. It would be extremely helpful if you were willing to give about 45 minutes of your time in order for [REDACTED] to interview you on a non-attributable basis. We do realise that you may be away over the summer and how many demands there are on your time, but your opinion will be invaluable to help us to shape this important project.

Thank you for kindly inviting me to lunch on Tuesday 23 September.


Regrettably, due to pre-existing engagements in London, it is not possible for me to attend the 2014 Climate Summit next week.

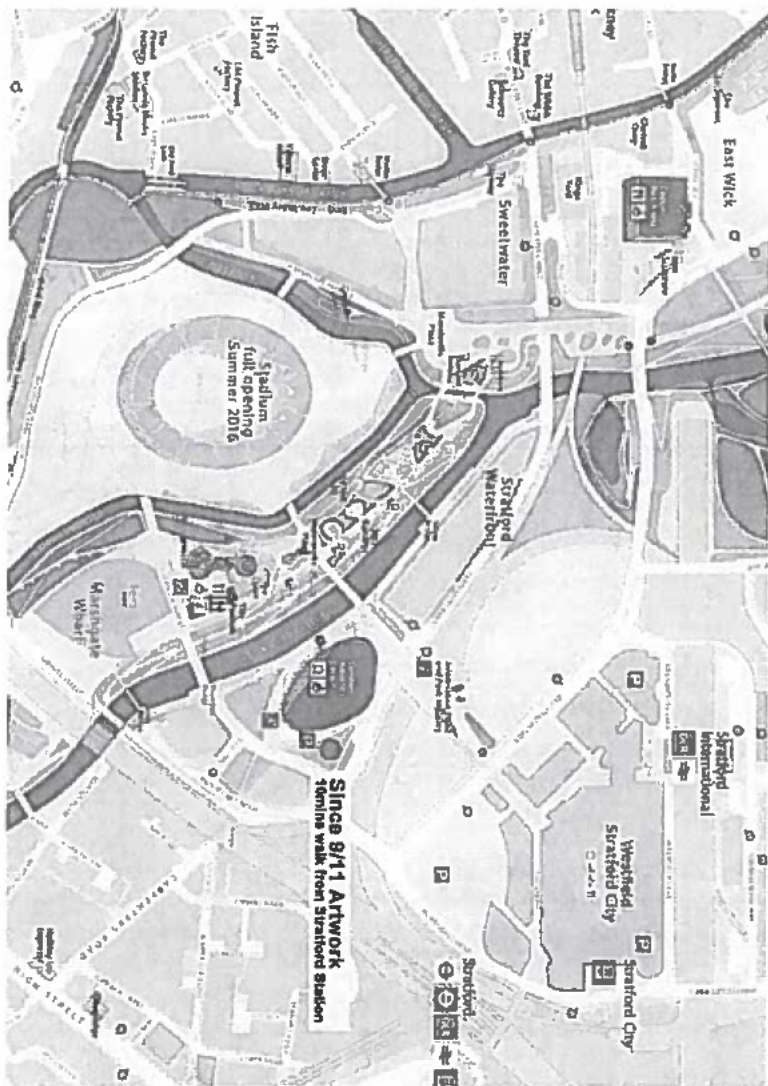




