Responsibility for IT is being passed to Transport for London during 2023. Following that transfer, the GLA's equipment, networking and infrastructure will be upgraded in line with TfL's upgrade plans.
Digital Transformation will remain the responsibility of the GLA's Digital Transformation Unit. We are still in the process of producing the Strategy and the associated portfolio of projects and activities. The key parts are expected to be:
- Forming the new Digital Experience Unit – starting November 2022.
 Formulating and agreeing the GLA's the new Digital Strategy and Programme – by end of March 2023 A smooth go-live to the IT Shared Service with TfL
